Other events have included the Career Fair, Business Convocation, and social events.

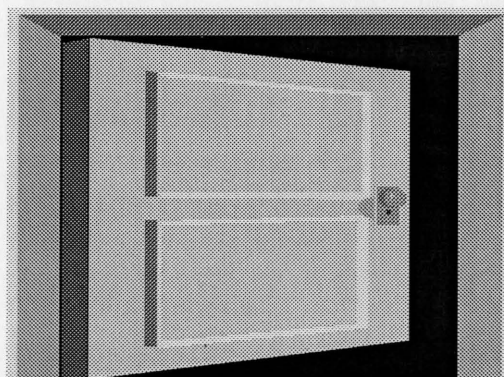

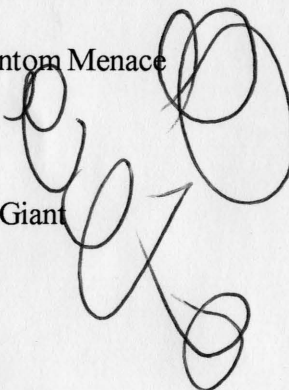
