MISSIONARY DIOCESE OF ALGOMA HELD FOR THE ELECTION OF A BISHOP

TUESDAY, JANUARY 16th, 1940

In accordance with the notice convening the Synod, issued at the request of the Right Reverend John G. Anderson, B.A., D.D., LL.D., Lord Bishop of Moosonee, Senior Bishop of the Ecclesiastical Province of Ontario and Acting Metropolitan, a special session of the Synod of the Diocese of Algoma was opened at Sault Ste. Marie, Ontario, on Tuesday, the 16th day of January, 1940.

The Synod had been called for the purpose of electing a Bishop to succeed the Right Reverend Rocksborough R. Smith, M. A., D. D., fourth Bishop of Algoma, whose resignation had taken effect on the 30th November, 1939.

Evening Prayer was said in St. Luke's Pro-Cathedral at 5 o'clock p.m. The service was read by the Rev. Canon Simpson, L. Th., the lessons being read by the Rev. Canon Colloton, B.A., B.D. At the close of the service the Very Rev. P. A. Paris, D.D., Dean of Algoma, installed the Ven. J. B. Lindsell as Archdeacon of Muskoka.

At 8 o'clock p.m. the Clergy and Lay Delegates met in St. Luke's Parish Hall, under the presidency of the Right Reverend the Lord Bishop of Moosonee.

The Bishop took the Chair at 8.15 o'clock and said prayers.

The Bishop then delivered a short Charge, dealing with the Ministry of the Church and its Scriptural authority.

The Chairman announced that the required number of each order was present to render it possible to proceed to the election of a Bishop under Canon 17 of the Diocesan Synod, and declared the Synod properly constituted.

PRESS COMMITTEE

The Chairman appointed the Rev. Canon Banks and Mr. D. H. Dixon a Press Committee.

It was moved by Canon Banks, seconded by Mr. J. F. Leake:

That for this Secial Synod, the fact of the election, and if deemed advisable the ballot upon which it takes place, be communicated to the Press by the Secretaries of Synod.

Upon being put, the motion was declared lost.

ORDER OF PROCEEDINGS

In accordance with notice given in the Convening Circular, it was moved by Mr. Chancellor Babe, seconded by Canon Colloton, Clerical Secretary:

That the following Order of Proceedings be adopted and observed for the guidance of the course of this present session of the Synod.

- (1) Before the actual routine business of this evening's meeting of the Synod be terminated, the Presiding Officer shall appoint the Scrutineers who will receive and count the ballots to be cast for the election of a new Bishop. These shall consist of two clergymen and one layman for the clerical vote, and two laymen and one clergyman for the lay vote.
- (2) Immediately after the Presiding Officer declares the routine business to be completed, all members of the Synod shall adjourn to the Pro-Cathedral where the clergy shall take seats on the north side of the nave, and the lay delegates on the south side, which plan shall be followed throughout the course of the Synod. The Scrutineers shall take their places at tables provided for them below the chancel steps.
- (3) All having assembled, the Presiding Officer shall offer prayer for the guidance of the Synod by the Holy Spirit, in the nominating and electing of a Bishop, allowing a short interval also for private prayer. After this he shall declare that the Synod is ready for nominations to be received. Such nominations shall not be made openly, but shall be written, clearly and distinctly, on ballots provided. Any member of the Synod may nominate more than one person if he sees fit, but the names of all his nominees shall be written on one ballot. Quietly the members shall advance to the Scrutineers' tables, and deposit their ballots of nomination in the boxes provided. When all such nomination ballots have been cast, the Presiding Officer shall say the Grace, and the members of the Synod shall return to St. Luke's Hall, where after the Scrutineers have examined the ballots. the names of all nominees shall be written on a blackboard. Names only shall be revealed, the Scrutineers being pledged not to disclose to any person the number of nomination ballots cast for any nominee. Time shall be given for the dissemination of information concerning the persons nominated, such information being accorded informally between the members of the Synod and without any speeches to advocate the cause of any one of the nominees. Following this informal gathering, the Synod shall adjourn until tomorrow morning.
- (4) All members of the Synod shall assemble for the celebration of Holy Communion at 8 a.m. tomorrow in the Pro-Cathedral, at which prayer

shall again be offered for the Holy Spirit's guidance of the Synod in the solemn matter of electing a Bishop. After the service the Synod will adjourn for breakfast.

(5) Reassembling in the Pro-Cathedral at 10 a.m. the Presiding Officer shall first offer prayer and then cause the roll of both Clerical and Lay

Delegates to be called.

(6) The Scrutineers having taken their places at the table, the Presiding Officer shall request that a few moments be devoted to private prayer, and that during the balloting there shall be no manifestations of feeling, but that all, by quiet and orderly demeanour, shall pay the deepest respect to the solemnity of the sacred duty in which they are engaged. The balloting shall then commence, and be conducted according to the following regulations.

I. THE CLERICAL VOTE

(a) The list of clergy, signed by the Secretaries, shall be delivered to the Scrutineers, and no vote shall be received from anyone whose name is not

on such list.

(b) A ballot box shall be provided with a lock, and a slit or groove in the top through which the ballot shall be dropped into the box, which shall in no case be unlocked or opened until the Scrutineers have retired with the same.

During the process of taking the ballot all parties shall keep their (e) seats, until the name of a clergyman shall be called by the Secretary, when

he shall advance to the Scrutineers' table.

(d) Each voter shall receive his ballot from the Scrutineers, and at a special table provided, shall write upon the ballot, clearly and distinctly, the name of the person for whom he votes. He shall then fold the hallot and deposit it in the box provided at the Scrutineers' table. The voter's name shall then be marked off on the Scrutineers' list, and having voted he shall then return to his seat.

The Scrutineers shall see that the result of their scrutiny corresponds with the number of those voting as ascertained from the list as

aforesaid.

(f) The Secretaries of the Synod shall receive the report of the Seru-

tineers, and shall then present it to the Presiding Officer.

(g) When the Scrutineers have made quite certain that the ballots have been counted correctly, and the Presiding Officer has declared the result, the ballots shall be publicly destroyed before the next vote is taken.

THE LAY VOTE II.

The Lay Vote shall be taken in exactly the same manner, the delegates being called by name, in alphabetical order.

During the order of proceedings no discussions shall be allowed or point of order verbally raised; but any appeal shall be reduced to writing and presented to the Presiding Officer, whose decision thereon shall be final, subject to appeal to the House.

The members of the Synod shall remain quietly in the Pro-Cathedral until the Presiding Officer has received the Scrutineers' Report, and has declared

the same.

If no nominee has received the requisite two-thirds majority vote in both orders, further ballots shall be taken in precisely the same manner. If no election is accomplished when three ballots have been taken, it shall be agreed that only those nominees who have received five or more votes in both orders on the third ballot shall be eligible for further balloting.

In the event of a deadlock developing, the Presiding Officer shall have the right to call for another ballot of nomination, which shall allow other names to be added to the original list, and votes shall be east in exactly the same manner as after the first nomination.

When an election has been accomplished the Presiding Officer, or one appointed by him, shall declare the fact, announcing the name of the elected person.

If the person elected is not a member of the Synod, a message shall immediately be sent to him by the Secretaries of the Synod, and, in any case, the person elected shall be given a reasonable time in which to make his decision as to whether or not he will accept the office.

The members of the Synod shall asemble again at an appointed time, and having proceeded to the Pro-Cathedral, the Presiding Officer shall read the message of the Bishop-elect erpressing his acceptance or refusal of the office. If his message is one of acceptance, after the singing of a hymn, the Presiding Officer shall say prayers and shall dismiss the Synod with the Blessing. If his message is one of refusal, balloting shall again be proceeded with in the manner provided above.

Upon being put, the above motion was carried nemine contradicente.

POOLING OF EXPENSES

It was moved by the Rev. P. F. Bull, seconded by the Rev. H. A. Sims:

That the Clergy now assembled agree to pooling of travelling expenses incurred in attending the Synod.

It was moved in amendment by the Rev. R. J. Morley, S.S. J.E., seconded by the Rev. C. M. Serson, S.S.J.E.:

That the following be added: "That such travelling expenses shall be limited to the railway fare, coach class, from the railway station at or nearest to the parish or mission in which each clerical delegate resides, and within the Diocese of Algoma."

After some discussion, in which it was shown that in some cases means of transportation other than the railway were necessary, the motion was withdrawn. The original motion was then put and carried unanimously by the Clergy.

The Chairman appointed the Rev. P. F. Bull and the Rev. J. D. Wall a committee on the pooling of the travelling expenses of the Clergy.

It was moved by Mr. H. R. Brooks, seconded by Mr. W. G. Hyland:

That the Lay Members of Synod assembled agree to the pooling of travelling expenses incurred in attending the Synod.

Carried unanimously by the Lay Members.

The Chairman appointed Mr. H. R. Brooks and Mr. J. F. Leake a committee on the pooling of travelling expenses of the Lay Delegates.

NEXT SESSION OF SYNOD

The Very Rev. P. A. Paris, Administrator of the Diocese, asked for a suspension of the rules of order to permit the Ven. J. B. Lindsell, Archdeacon of Muskoka, to bring in a motion which had been omitted from the convening circular. This being granted,

It was moved by the Ven. J. B. Lindsell, seconded by the Rev. A. J. Bull:

That the next regular meeting of the Synod of Algoma be held in the year 1942, at the time appointed for the meeting, instead of the year 1941, subject to the approval of the Bishop of the Diocese. Carried.

NOMINATION

The Chairman appointed the following Scrutineers for the nomination and election ballots:

The routine business of the Synod was declared completed, and the Synod adjourned to the Pro-Cathedral to receive nominations for the office of Bishop of Algoma.

SYNOD SERVICE

The members of Synod assembled in St. Luke's Pro-Cathedral at 8 o'clock a.m., for the Synod service. The Holy Communion was celebrated by the Very Rev. P. A. Paris, D. D., Dean and Rector of the Pro-Cathedral, the Right Reverend the Lord Bishop of Moosonee pontificating. The Gospel was read by the Ven. C. W. Balfour, M. A., Archdeacon of Algoma, and the Epistle by the Ven. J. B. Lindsell, Archdeacon of Muskoka. The Rev. Canon Colloton assisted at the administration.

After the service breakfast was served in the parish hall by the ladies of St. Luke's.

ELECTION

The Synod reassembled in the Pro-Cathedral at ten o'clock for the election of a Bishop.

The Chairman, the Bishop of Moosonee, offered prayer for

the guidance of the Holy Spirit.

There may be great difficulties ahead in building up the Church, in fighting evil, and in dealing with financial problems; but if we all go forth in a great adventure in the Name of Christ and His Church, clergy and laity moving shoulder to shoulder in complete co-operation, we will be more than conquerors through the power of the Holy Spirit.

The hymn, "Thy hand, O God, has guided Thy Church from age to age" was sung, the Bishop of Moosonee said prayers, the members of Synod joined in the General Thanksgiving, and the Bishop pronounced the Benediction.
