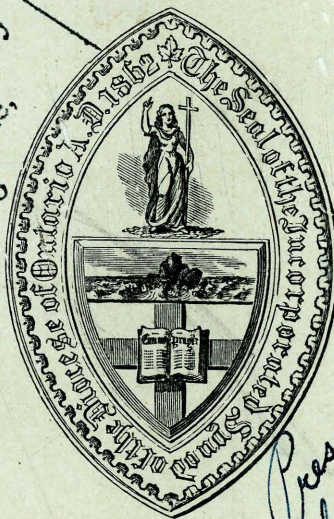

JOURNAL OF SYNOD.

THIRTY-SEVENTH SESSION.

KINGSTON, Monday, June 4th, 1900.

The Thirty-seventh Session of the Incorporated Synod of the Diocese of Ontario opened this day.

DIVINE SERVICE.

Evening Prayer was said in St. Paul's Church at 8 p.m. by the Venerable T. Bedford-Jones, LL.D., D.C.L., Archdeacon of Ontario.

The First Lesson was read by the Rev. Edwin Loucks, Rector of Picton and Rural Dean of Prince Edward; and the Second Lesson by the Rev. Canon Burke, B.A., Rector of Belleville.

The sermon was preached by the Rev. D. F. Bogert, M.A., Rector of St. John's Church, Belleville, and Rural Dean of Hastings, from Ephes. iv., 1—3: "I...beseech you that ye walk worthy of the vocation wherewith ye are called, with all lowliness and meekness, with long suffering, forbearing one another in love, endeavouring to keep the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace."

FIRST DAY.

KINGSTON, Tuesday, June 5th, 1900.

The Holy Communion was celebrated at 10 a.m., in St. Paul's Church, by the Venerable the Archdeacon of Ontario, assisted by the Very Reverend the Dean of Ontario, who read the Gospel; the Venerable W. B. Carey, M.A., Archdeacon of Quinte, who read the Epistle; and the Rev. Professor Worrell, M.A., Rector of Barriefield.

The offerings at both services were in aid of the Mission Fund.

CREDENTIALS OF LAY REPRESENTATIVES.

At 11 a.m. the Lay Secretary, with Messrs. R. G. Wright and F. J. C. Tighe, was in attendance at the Synod Hall to receive and examine the certificates of the Lay Representatives.

BUSINESS MEETING.

At 11.30 a.m. His Grace the Archbishop took the chair, and the opening prayers were said by the Archdeacon of Ontario.

The Clerical Secretary called the roll of the clergy; and the Lay Secretary called the roll of the parishes and missions. Of the former 63 were present during the session; of the latter 49 parishes or missions were represented by 102 Lay Representatives.

A quorum of both orders was found to be present.

COURT ON CONTESTED SEATS.

Under a suspension of the rules of order, His Grace the Archbishop appointed the Chancellor, the Dean, the Rev. Prof. Worrell, Judge McDonald, and Dr. Smythe, Q.C., to be a Court on Contested Seats; to which was referred a protest against the election of a Lay Representative from Leeds Rear. (Appendix B—1.)

AUDITORS' REPORT.

The Rev. Stearne Tighe presented and read the Auditors' Report for the last financial year, which was adopted on his motion, seconded by the Rev. Rural Dean Loucks. (Appendix E—1.)

REPORT OF FINANCE COMMITTEE.

Under a suspension of the rules of order, the report of the Finance Committee was presented and read by the Rev. Stearne Tighe, on whose motion it was adopted. (Appendix D—2.)

ELECTION OF OFFICERS.

On motion of the Archdeacon of Ontario, seconded by the Rev. J. W. Jones, it was resolved,

That the Rev. Canon Spencer be re-elected Clerical Secretary.

On motion of Mr. Edw. J. B. Pense, seconded by Mr. R. J. Carson, it was resolved,

That Mr. R. Vashon Rogers, LL D., Q.C., be re-elected Lay Secretary.

On motion of the Archdeacon of Quinte, seconded by the Rev. Rural Dean Bogert, it was resolved,

That Mr. E. H. Smythe, Q.C., LL.D., be re-elected Treasurer.

On motion of the Archdeacon of Ontario, seconded by the Rev. Rural Dean Bogert, it was resolved,

That the Rev. Stearne Tighe, Mr. R. J. Carson, and Mr. Allan Turner be re-elected the Audit and Accounts Committee for the ensuing year.

CONFIRMATION OF MINUTES.

On motion of the Clerical Secretary, seconded by the Rev. Canon Burke, the minutes of the Thirty-sixth Session of Synod, as printed in the Journal of that Session, were taken as read, and were confirmed.

CORRESPONDENCE.

A communication from the Board of Management of the Domestic and Foreign Missionary Society was read, and on motion of the Clerical Secretary was referred to the Diocesan Committee on Domestic and Foreign Missions. (Appendix B—2.)

OCCUPATION OF PRETORIA.

At this point a communication was made to His Grace the Archbishop stating that it had been officially announced that Lord Roberts was now in occupation of Pretoria, the capital of the Transvaal. On His Grace making this known to the Synod, the members sang "God Save the Queen," gave three cheers for Her Majesty and Lord Roberts, and sang the Doxology.

PROVINCIAL SYNOD FOR ONTARIO.

Communications from the Synods of Toronto and Huron inviting the action of this Synod with a view to the formation of a Provincial Synod for the Civil Province of Ontario were read (Appendix B—3), and on motion of the Clerical Secretary were referred to a special committee consisting of the Archdeacons of Ontario and Quinte, Canon Spencer, Professor Worrell, the Rev. Messrs. Tighe and French, the Chancellor, Judge McDonald, Dr. R. Vashon Rogers, Q. C., Messrs. Pense, Carson, and O'Loughlin, to consider and report at the present session the advisability or otherwise of appointing a Committee to confer with Committees of the other Dioceses in the Province of Ontario on the subject of such communications.

REGISTRAR'S REPORT.

Mr. Shannon presented and read his report as Registrar of the Diocese, and moved its adoption.

Moved by Canon Spencer, seconded by the Archdeacon of Quinte, in amendment,

That inasmuch as the Rev. W. A. Gustin has not yet been transferred to the Diocese of Toronto, the reference to that gentleman in the report be struck out.

The amendment having been carried, the report as amended was then adopted. (Appendix D—16.)

LAY REPRESENTATION OF LEEDS REAR.

At this point the Court on Contested Seats reported its decision in favour of Dr. R. J. Gardiner as the second Lay Representative from the parish of Leeds Rear. (Appendix B—1.)

TREASURER'S REPORT.

Dr. E. H. Smythe, Q.C., presented and read his report as Treasurer for the last financial year, which on his motion, seconded by the Rev. Stearne Tighe, was adopted. (Appendix D—17.)

The Synod adjourned till 3 p.m.

Afternoon Session.

The Synod re-assembled at 3 p.m.

That the consideration of the report be deferred till the motions of the Rev. Rural Dean Jarvis and Mr. H. Briscoe, of which notice has been given, come up for consideration.

VISITING CLERGYMEN.

At this point His Grace the Archbishop invited the following visiting clergymen to take seats in the Synod, viz.: The Rev. Canon W. J. Muckleston and the Rev. W. M. Loucks, of the Diocese of Ottawa.

REPORT ON DECEASED MEMBERS OF SYNOD.

His Honour Judge McDonald presented and read the report of the Committee on the Deceased Members of Synod, which was on his motion adopted as follows :

The Standing Committee appointed to report in reference to deceased members of the Synod begs to report as follows :—

Since the last meeting of Synod the following clergymen have died, viz. : Reverend William Herbert Smythe and Reverend R. James Harvey, L.S.T.

William Herbert Smythe was born at Reedham, near Yarmouth, Norfolk, England, in 1814. Some forty-five years ago he came to America and lived for a number of years in the southern part of the United States. He was made Deacon in the Diocese of Tennessee at Calvary Church, Memphis, on Easter Day in 1860, and ordered Priest in the Diocese of Michigan, at Marshall, on Easter Day, in 1870. Between these periods he came to this Diocese and was Missionary at Tamworth from 1864 to 1869 when he removed to Michigan. Returning to Canada he was Missionary at Wellington from 10th January, 1887, to 1st January, 1890, in which year he retired and was superannuated. He frequently took duty in vacant Parishes or Missions, or during the absence or illness of brother clergymen. Mr. Smythe was the author of "The Church, Rome, and Dissent," and "The Invitation Answered." He died at Ottawa, Ontario, on the 20th April, 1900, at the advanced age of eighty-six years.

Richard James Harvey was a native of Dover, England, and a son of Captain Harvey, R.E., who was stationed at Bytown, now Ottawa, at the time of the construction of the Rideau Canal. He was educated at Lennoxville, Quebec, was made Deacon on the 18th November, 1877, and ordered Priest on the 8th June, 1879, by the Lord Bishop of Quebec. For a time Mr. Harvey was a Missionary at Gaspé, and in 1879 for a time took duty in Lancashire, England. In November, 1879, he was licensed to Stafford in the Diocese of Ontario, and in July, 1887, was appointed to North Gower. In 1889 he removed to Stirling where he remained until September, 1892, when he obtained leave of absence and went to England. After a prolonged visit there he returned to Ontario, and on 19th June, 1895, was appointed Missionary at Kitley. During Evensong at St. Thomas' Church, Frankville, on Christmas Eve, 1899, he was stricken with paralysis, but made so great a recovery that hopes of his restoration to health were entertained. But another stroke came and was fatal. He died at Frankville on Sunday, 27th May, 1900, and the burial took place at Easton's Corners on Tuesday, the 29th May,—nine of his brother clergymen being in attendance, six of whom acted as pall bearers.

Since the last meeting of Synod two lay delegates have passed away, and singular to say they were brothers.

His Honour James Reynolds, Junior Judge of the County Court of the United Counties of Leeds and Grenville, was a native of Brockville. For many years he practised his profession at Prescott and was for some time a lay delegate from that Parish. In 1878 he removed to Brockville and became a member of the congregation of Trinity Church, of which the Rev. E. P. Crawford was then Rector. He represented this parish in the Diocesan Synod for many years and was a member at the time of his death which occurred in September, 1899. Judge Reynolds was frequently elected a delegate to the Provincial Synod, and a member of the Mission Board, and did faithful service in both positions. Within the last two years he caused to be erected at the front of Trinity Church, as a memorial to his parents, a handsome porch.

Samuel Reynolds, Local Registrar of the High Court of Justice, Clerk of the County Court, and Registrar of the Surrogate Court of the United Counties of Leeds and Grenville, was born at Brockville on 7th March, 1835. His parents were zealous members of the Church of England, and in the records of those who communicated at Brockville some eighty years since,—which records are preserved in the Synod vault,—are to be found the names of Mr. and Mrs. Samuel Reynolds. Mr. Reynolds was for some time a lay delegate to this Synod from St. Peter's Church, Brockville, and also a church warden. He took an active part in the foundation of the new parish of St. Paul's, Brockville, and was one of its first church wardens and for many years a lay delegate from that congregation, and although not able to give to the discharge of the duties of the office such attention as he would have wished, he took a keen interest in the affairs of the Diocese. Mr. Reynolds did not long survive his brother, Judge Reynolds, and died at Brockville on the 14th day of March, 1900.

Thomas Shannon, Post Master of Picton, and for many years a representative of that Parish in the Synod and for some time a member of the Mission Board, died in the month of August, 1899. Mr. Shannon was faithful in his attendance as a delegate and took a warm interest in Synod affairs. His Rector, Rev. E. Loucks, Rural Dean, speaks of him as a liberal giver.

That Canon XVI be amended by inserting the following words after the word "payment" in section 6, line 10 :

"Or if he shall pay the annual subscription due at the time of payment,
"and shall undertake by written instrument under his hand to pay all arrears,
"with interest as aforesaid, by annual instalments of not less than ten dollars,
"as shall be agreed upon between the said clergyman, the Clerical Secretary,
"and the chairman of the Committee for the time being"; and by adding the following words at the end of the section :

"Provided always that if any clergyman thus paying arrears of subscrip-
"tions by instalments shall die before the total amount of such arrears with
"interest shall have been paid by him, the balance due at the time of his death
"shall be deducted from the annuity payable to his widow or orphans in such
"manner as the committee shall determine."

Austin Smith and Messrs. R. J. Gardiner, M.D., and George Bawden be scrutineers of the vote for Lay Members of the Mission Board.

That the Lay Scrutineers for the election of a Coadjutor Bishop be His Honour Judge McDonald, His Honour Judge Wilkison, and Mr. Edw. J. B. Pense.

On motion of the Archdeacon of Ontario, seconded by Rev. Canon Spencer, it was resolved,

That the Rev. Canon Grout, the Rev. H. B. Patton, and the Rev. Rural Dean Jarvis be the scrutineers on behalf of the clergy for the election of a Coadjutor Bishop.

Moved by the Rev. F. D. Woodcock, seconded by the Rev. F. T. Dibb, and resolved,

That the Rev. A. L. McTear, the Rev. G. W. Swayne, and Mr. B. S. O'Loughlin be scrutineers of the clerical vote for the Mission Board.

Moved by the Rev. F. T. Dibb, seconded by the Rev. F. D. Woodcock, and resolved,

That the following be the scrutineers of the clerical vote for Provincial Synod:—Rev. W. P. Reeve, Rev. B. F. Byers, and Dr. Hudson.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS.

A motion, of which the Rev. J. W. Jones had given notice for the amendment of Canon XVI, was by consent of the Synod withdrawn by the mover.

SEE HOUSE MORTGAGE INTEREST.

On motion of Dr. Smythe, Q.C., seconded by the Rev. Canon Grout, it was resolved,

That Canon XI (Assessment Fund) be amended in section 8 by adding these words to the end thereof: "And until the sale of the present See House to provide for the interest on the mortgage for \$10,000 given by the trustees thereof to the Synod, or for such part of the said interest as is not met by the collections at confirmation services set apart for that purpose."

INSURANCE OF SYNOD PROPERTY.

On motion of Dr. Smythe, Q.C., seconded by Mr. B. S. O'Loughlin, it was resolved,

That a special committee be appointed, consisting of the Very Reverend the Dean, the Rev. Rural Dean Wright, the Clerical Secretary, Mr. B. S. O'Loughlin, the Chancellor, the Lay Secretary, the Registrar, and the mover, to report to the Synod, or the Executive Committee thereof, what are the present arrangements for the insurance of Synod properties, or properties held by the Synod in mortgage; what rates are paid therefor, and what (if any) changes are desirable.

SENIORITY OF CLERGY BY ORDINATION.

On motion of the Rev. A. L. McTear, seconded by the Rev. H. B. Patton, it was resolved,

That the Committee on the Seniority of Clergy prepare a list of the clergy of the Diocese in order of seniority by ordination, to be published in the Journal of Synod for the information of Synod.

ELECTION OF DELEGATES, ETC.

At noon the vote for members of the Mission Board and for delegates to the Provincial Synod was taken by ballot, and the Synod adjourned till 3 p.m.

Proceedings for Election of Coadjutor Bishop.

His Grace the Archbishop called the attention of the Synod to the important and solemn duty now devolving upon its members,—the election of a Coadjutor Bishop for the Diocese. His Grace requested that all the members kneel in prayer for the blessing of Almighty God, and that they specially invoke the aid of the Holy Spirit to guide them in their choice of a fit person for the office and work of a Bishop in this Diocese; and that for this purpose silence be kept for a space.

The members thereupon knelt in silent prayer for a few minutes; after which the Archdeacon of Ontario said the prayer to be used before the election of a Bishop:—

PRAYER BEFORE THE ELECTION OF A BISHOP.

O Almighty God our Heavenly Father, who hast purchased to Thyself an Universal Church by the precious blood of Thy dear Son and hast appointed divers orders in the same: Be pleased at this time so to enlighten and guide by Thy Holy Spirit the minds of the Clergy and Lay Delegates now about to assemble in Synod, that they may faithfully and wisely make choice of a fit person for the office and work of a Bishop in this Diocese, who shall be pleasing to Thee in holiness of life and conversation, to the glory of Thy Name and the edifying and well governing of Thy Church; through the merits of our Saviour Jesus Christ, who liveth and reigneth with Thee and the Holy Ghost, world without end. Amen.

The Chancellor then read Canon XLI (For the election of a Coadjutor Bishop), and section 3 of Canon XXIV (On the election of a Bishop).

The following instructions were distributed among the members:—

ELECTION OF A COADJUTOR BISHOP.

Instructions to the Clergy, Lay Representatives, and Scrutineers.

By Authority of His Grace the Archbishop of Ontario.

TO THE CLERGY AND LAY REPRESENTATIVES :

Each clergyman and lay representative will be furnished with a voting paper, on which he will write the name of the person for whom he wishes to vote giving such initials or titles as may easily designate him.

The names of the several parishes will be called as recorded on the printed synod list.

THE CLERGYMAN of the parish, when so called, shall go to the *clerical* ballot box, and giving his name to the scrutineers shall deposit his ballot in the box.

THE LAY REPRESENTATIVES of the parish, when so called, shall go together to the *lay* ballot box : and each giving his name shall hand his ballot to one of the scrutineers, who shall place them together in one envelope, and having closed it securely shall deposit it in the ballot box.

TO THE SCRUTINEERS :

Before voting commences care shall be taken that the ballot boxes are empty.

As each *clergyman* or each *parish* votes, a mark shall be placed opposite his or its name on the printed list showing that such clergyman or parish has voted.

On retiring to count the votes, the number of votes cast shall be first ascertained. If less than two-thirds of the clergy entitled to vote have cast their ballots, the scrutineers shall so report to the lay scrutineers ; if less than two-thirds of the parishes entitled to vote have cast their ballots, the scrutineers shall so report to the clerical scrutineers.

The votes of the clergy and of the parishes respectively for the several candidates having been counted, the scrutineers shall report as follows :—

- (a) Number of clergy (or parishes) who have voted.
- (b) Number of votes necessary for election.
- (c) The names in order of those who have received votes together with the number of such votes, according to the number of votes received.
- (d) Number of votes lost ; and for what cause.
- (e) Whether or not any person has received the number of votes requisite for election.

The CLERICAL SCRUTINEERS shall deposit in an envelope all clerical votes cast and deliver it to the Secretaries of Synod.

The LAY SCRUTINEERS shall replace the ballots in their several envelopes, and having deposited them in a larger one, shall deliver it to the Secretaries of Synod. All ballots shall be preserved by the Secretaries of Synod until after the election, then they shall be destroyed.

FIRST BALLOT.

The Clerical Secretary called the roll of the Clergy, each clergyman casting his ballot as his name was called ; and the Lay

Secretary called the roll of the Laity, who voted by parishes, the Lay representatives of each parish casting their ballots in the manner provided in the "Instructions."

After all had voted the ballot was declared closed, and the scrutineers retired to count the votes.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS.

By leave of the Synod, the Rev. Rural Dean Bogert withdrew his motion for the amendment of Canon XII allowed to stand over from last session as unfinished business. (Journal of 36th Session, p. 533.)

The Synod reassembled at 11 a.m., the Chancellor presiding in the temporary absence of His Grace the Archbishop.

Before any formal opening of the morning session, it had become known to the members of Synod that the Bishop of Algoma found himself unable to accept.

The Synod accordingly resolved itself immediately into conferences of the clergy and laity, by whom committees of conference were appointed similar to those of last evening.

At 1.15 p.m. the Synod reassembled, and was opened with prayer by the Dean of Ontario.

COMMUNICATIONS.

The following telegram was read from the Ven. Archdeacon Llwyd, Commissary of the Bishop of Algoma :

HUNTSVILLE, ONT., June 7th, 1900.

The Bishop of Algoma says, "I cannot see my way clear to "abandon the work to which the whole Canadian Church by its "chief Synod has called me. The authority which appointed me "can alone relieve me."

EIGHTH BALLOT.

An eighth ballot was then taken in the manner prescribed in the "Instructions"; and the scrutineers having retired to count the votes, the Synod adjourned till 3.45 p.m.

Afternoon Session.

The Synod reassembled at 3.45 p.m., the Chancellor presiding. The scrutineers reported the result of the balloting as follows :

It was thereupon resolved on motion of Judge McDonald, seconded by the Archdeacon of Ontario,

That this Synod does hereby confirm and ratify the arrangement made with His Grace the Archbishop, set forth in the report of the Executive Committee just adopted, including the instrument as to stipend dated May 15th, 1900; and that the Very Rev. the Dean of Ontario, the Archdeacon of Ontario, the Rev. Professor Worrell, the Rev. Stearne Tighe, Judge Wilkison, Judge McDonald, Mr. E. J. B. Pense, and Dr. E. H. Smythe, Q.C., shall be and are appointed a Committee with authority to add to their number; such Committee to take charge of all needful matters in connection with carrying out the arrangements above mentioned.

The Synod then adjourned till 5 p.m. On reassembling at that hour, no reply having yet been received from the Very Rev. Dean Williams, it was resolved, on motion of Judge McDonald, seconded by the Rev. J. W. Forster,

That in case Dean Williams does not accept, the Synod when it adjourns this day do stand adjourned till Wednesday, the 20th instant, at 7.30 p.m.; then to continue the election of a Coadjutor Bishop; and that the Secretary in such case do issue notice of the meeting; and that in the event of Dean Williams' acceptance the Secretary do send circulars to the members of Synod announcing the fact.

The Synod then adjourned, the Clerical Secretary pronouncing the benediction.

Memorials, Correspondence, etc., and Action Thereon.**I.—DECISION OF COURT ON CONTESTED SEATS IN SYNOD.**

The Committee on Contested Seats have considered the matter of the protest filed by Dr. Gardiner, claiming the seat for the parish of Leeds Rear in respect of the church at Seeley's Bay.

It is admitted by the parties that Dr. Gardiner was duly elected for three years at Easter, 1899. Dr. Gardiner not having attended communion in his own parish between Easter, 1899, and Easter, 1900, the Rev. Mr. Forster assumed that he had become disqualified and had forfeited his seat, and without giving him any notice he called a meeting at Seeley's Bay for the election of a new delegate, at which meeting Mr. Bower was elected. Dr. Gardiner states that the assumption of the Rev. Mr. Forster was incorrect, and that as a matter of fact he had communicated three times at Newboro during the year, and that if called upon he could have produced evidence to that effect.

The Committee, being satisfied of the truth of Dr. Gardiner's statement, are of opinion that the Rev. Mr. Forster erred in taking the course which he did; that it should have been assumed in favour of Dr. Gardiner, in the absence of evidence to the contrary, that he still remained qualified. The Committee therefore find that he is the properly qualified delegate.

ACTION REQUESTED OF BISHOPS AND DIOCESAN SYNODS.

On motion of the Bishop of Ottawa, seconded by Dr. R. Vashon Rogers, Q.C., it was resolved,

" That the Board of Management of the Domestic and Foreign Missionary Society respectfully request each Bishop of this Province to draw the attention of the Clergy and Laity, in Synod assembled, to the deplorable indifference to the great missionary interests of the Church prevailing in our parishes as shown by the following considerations:—

" (1). That although the resolutions of the Board contemplate the formation of a missionary committee in connection with the Board itself in every parish and mission, yet notwithstanding repeated appeals for the formation of such committees, few have been formed or do now exist ;

" (2). That although 21,000 copies of the Annual Report of the Board, containing special appeals in regard to the parochial committee's circulation of the Canadian Church Magazine and Mission News (the organ of the Board), and for more earnest influence on the part of the Clergy and their flocks in behalf of the work of the Board, were generally distributed, little if any discoverable response has been made to the appeals, apparently indicating that the report itself cannot have reached the members of the congregations ;

" (3). That although in September or October last a special circular was issued from the office of the Magazine by direction of the Board, conveying extracts from the constitution and resolutions of the Board to the 1000 Clergy of the Province, and offering the Magazine free for a period of six months to such of the Clergy as signified their willingness to receive it, only eighty-seven responses were received ;

" (4). That although special sample copies of the Juvenile, with special offer, were communicated to the Clergy, yet the total of orders between the 21st of December and the 1st of April amount only to 289 additional copies ;

" (5). That although special offer of mite boxes free for Lenten Offerings of the Sunday School children was made in connection with the Children's Lenten Letter, sent out to every one of the 1000 Clergy of the Province, only ninety-six responses for and acceptance of the mite boxes for their schools were received, representing only a total of 5770 boxes ;

" (6). That although the Cycle of Prayer authorized by the Board, containing subjects for prayers for missions arranged for a month, has been notified as ready both in connection with the appeals and the Annual Report, and by advertisement in the Canadian Church Magazine and Mission News, yet comparatively few copies have been circulated.

" That the Bishops be further requested to induce their Synods to consider and discuss the various means which may be used by the Clergy, Sunday School Teachers, children, and laymen in each parish to promote the missionary work of the Church, and to adopt such resolution or canon as will make it the duty of each clergyman to use the various means indicated by the Board in behalf of the Church for inducing every member of the Church, from

"the young children attending Sunday School up through all ages and ranks of men and women, to promote the Church's missionary work.

"That the Bishops be asked to have a copy of such canon sent to the Secretary of the Board for its information."

3.—PROVINCIAL SYNOD FOR THE CIVIL PROVINCE OF ONTARIO.

(1) LETTER FROM THE SYNOD OF THE DIOCESE OF TORONTO.

TORONTO, 14th May, 1900.

The Secretary-Treasurer Diocese of Ontario, Kingston, Ont. :

DEAR SIR :—

At the Session of the Synod of the Diocese of Toronto, held in June, 1899, a Committee was appointed "To continue the promotion of the constitution of a Provincial Synod for the Civil Province of Ontario, advocated in the Memorial addressed by this Synod to the Provincial Synod of Canada at its last Session, and to co-operate with any committees appointed, or which may be appointed by other Dioceses for the same purpose."

The following resolution has been adopted by the Committee appointed in accordance with the above resolution :—

"That the Chairman of this Committee, Mr. J. A. Worrell, Q.C. (Chancellor of the Diocese), be empowered to correspond with the several Dioceses of the Civil Province of Ontario, and request them to appoint at their Sessions in the year 1900, a committee to co-operate with the Committee of the Diocese of Toronto in arranging to hold a joint conference, to be held in the ensuing autumn, for the purpose of thoroughly considering and determining upon the action to be taken in regard to the constitution of a Provincial Synod for the said Province, and to nominate two representatives to attend such conference."

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON THE BISHOP'S ADDRESS.

To His Lordship the Bishop, and the Synod of the Diocese of Huron :

Your Committee appointed for the purpose, having considered such re-

marks in your Lordship's charge to the Synod as seems to require action, beg leave to report as follows:

After the formation of the General Synod of Canada, with the consent and concurrence of the various Provincial and Diocesan Synods, and after the organization of that Synod, and the election of its various officers and committees for the transaction of the general affairs of the Church in Canada, including its general missionary work, your Committee deems it of the greatest importance that everything possible should be done to make the General Synod the active, working and effective body to pronounce upon and transact matters outside of the local works and pronouncements of Diocesan Synods, and your Committee considers it a source of deep regret that the Provincial Synod of Canada and the Board of Domestic and Foreign Missions did not, during the last session of the Provincial Synod, take more decided and effective steps to submit to the General Synod and to the General Board of Missions constituted by the General Synod, more complete charge and control of the many matters assigned to them respectively in their organization; and that this Synod should express its regret and great disappointment that the Provincial Synod of Canada did not grant the prayer of the petition of the Synod of Huron relating to the triennial meetings of the Provincial Synod; and your Committee advises that unless the Provincial Synod accede to that oft repeated request steps be taken to assist, by constitutional means, in forming a Provincial Synod of Ontario, with boundaries coterminous with those of the civil Province of Ontario, and with jurisdiction which will not infringe upon the jurisdiction intended to be conferred upon the General Synod, and with such representation and meetings as will greatly reduce the cost without impairing the efficiency of Church legislation.

Your Committee presents anew the following report of a former Committee of the Synod of Huron, which report was adopted unanimously by the members of this Synod, and your Committee again repeats the statements and recommendations therein contained:

Your Committee finds that it is absolutely necessary (and your Committee desires) to maintain, and if possible improve the good management of the affairs of the Church in Canada, and at the same time to reduce the expenses thereof, and your Committee finds also that the most practicable and desirable means to that end is to so amend the Constitution of the Provincial Synod at the next two concurrent sessions thereof, that as far as practicable the General Synod should supersede the Provincial Synod of Canada, and the latter should meet (if at all) only when necessity may require a session thereof; and your Committee recommends that the various Diocesan Synods in this Province be respectfully requested to unite in the endeavor to procure such amendments to the Constitution and By-Laws of the Provincial Synod as will abolish or materially reduce the number of sessions and expense of the Provincial Synod, and as will conduce to the strength, usefulness and efficiency of the General Synod.

And your Committee recommend that in the event of the adoption of this report by the Synod, a copy of the foregoing clauses of this report be sent to the Primate of Canada and to the Provincial Synod of Canada, and to the various Diocesan Synods within the civil Province of Ontario.

1.—REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON STIPEND OF COADJUTOR BISHOP.

Your Committee upon stipend for Coadjutor Bishop were appointed to carry out the resolution of Synod of Session of 1898, to provide \$2,500 per year and a sufficient sum for a residence prior to the proposed election. An appeal to the parishes for voluntary offerings to supplement the income from invested funds has met a response that ensures the payment for the first year. The stipend will be forthcoming from—

1st—Balance of Episcopal Fund after paying \$1,400 to the Arch-bishop, and \$140 to rest account	\$1,460 00
2nd—Accumulated interest upon Augmentation Fund	360 30
3rd—Interest upon \$13,000 of the Augmentation Fund	520 00
4th—Offerings of parishes, \$345 of which has been made, the rest being in specific pledges	736 25

\$3,076 55

Seventeen parishes have yet to make known their offerings, which will probably swell the fund to \$3,200. The amount your committee had in view for the first year was \$3,000, but it is advisable to provide against shrinkage.

For the second year's stipend, beginning November 1st, 1901, there promises to be available from the Episcopal Fund, as before, \$1,460. Then the subscriptions to the Augmentation Fund have reached \$28,000, and for each of several months in succession \$1,000 has been paid in, while the collections are becoming more successful as they proceed. It is safe to assume that \$30,000 will be on hand in December, 1901, yielding \$1,200 a year. Thus \$2,660 will be provided from the two sources, and it is hereby recommended if the balance required be not forthcoming through increases in the sources of income mentioned, from balance from first year or from voluntary offerings, that the amount be provided by the Finance Committee out of the Assessment Fund, even though an increase in the regular assessment be necessary. For the third year's stipend no concern need be felt, as the Augmentation Fund will in all probability provide ample support.

3.—REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON RELIGIOUS INSTRUCTION IN SCHOOLS.

The Committee on Religious Instruction in Public Schools reports as follows :—

The Committee appointed by the Provincial Synod has held several meetings in Toronto, but on no occasion was there a representative attendance of the members, and little has been accomplished. Proposals have been made to the Honourable the Minister of Education, and they are now under his consideration. Meanwhile, through the energy of Mr. L. Baldwin, a voluntary school has been opened in Toronto in accordance with the scheme proposed by him in 1898. The result of this venture is being carefully watched, and may have a great effect on the future solution of this important and difficult problem of how to introduce religious instruction in the Public Schools.

Your Committee is prepared to join in the efforts of the Provincial Committee whenever its co-operation may be needed, and for that purpose asks to be reappointed for another year.

4.—REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON SENIORITY OF CLERGY.

The Committee on the Seniority of the Clergy in connection with the Clergy Trust Commutation Fund have the honour to present the following supplementary report :—

The Committee was authorized by the Executive Committee, at its last meeting, to hear the objections which had been sent in, in pursuance of a notice given by the Clerical Secretary, to the list which was appended to the former report, and will be found in the Journal for 1899, at page 553. These objections were, after due notice to all parties interested, considered by the committee on the 31st day of May, 1900. All objections tending to alter or affect the standing of those upon the list had been withdrawn before the Committee met, and it only remained for it to make some verbal changes, which appear in the schedule to this report. The Committee would recommend that the list as finally revised be reprinted in the Journal for the present year. Of the clergy in last year's list, three have come on the Fund, three have died, and seven have left the diocese.

Reports of the Standing Committees.**1.—REPORT OF EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE.**

The Executive Committee begs to present the following report:—

1. That at its regular meeting, holden at Kingston on May 17th, 1900, a sub-committee, which had been appointed to confer with His Grace the Archbishop, reported and submitted an agreement and an indenture, of which the following are copies:—

AGREEMENT.

To the Executive Committee of the Synod of Ontario:

It has been and is hereby agreed by and between His Grace the Archbishop of Ontario and the sub-committee representing the Executive Committee aforesaid, as follows:—

There shall be a meeting of Synod held in the month of June, 1900, beginning by Divine Service on Monday evening, 4th June, and proceeding to business on Tuesday morning, the 5th day of June.

At such meeting of Synod the election of a Coadjutor Bishop of and for such Diocese shall be proceeded with and had, and the same shall be held on Wednesday, the 6th day of June, 1900, commencing at three o'clock in the afternoon.

The Secretaries, in issuing the notices of the meeting of Synod, shall give full notice of such election.

The consecration of the Coadjutor who shall be elected shall be held at as early a date as conveniently may be, it being agreed that if possible it shall be so held on St. Luke's Day, 18th October, and at any rate not later than the last day of October, 1900.

The Archbishop agrees to do all in his power to expedite the time of the holding of such consecration.

The Archbishop agrees and undertakes that from and after the consecration of the Coadjutor His Grace shall leave to him the exercise of all Diocesan authority and functions and the patronage of the Diocese.

There shall be allowed to the Archbishop, in case of the election of a Coadjutor, the sum of fourteen hundred dollars per year from the income of the Episcopal Fund,—he to receive in addition the sums to which he shall be entitled from the Commutation Fund and from Macaulay award.

The agreement as to the sum to be allowed to the Archbishop as mentioned in the last preceding clause shall take effect upon and from the thirty-first day of October, 1900.

Should it be needful to amend any Canon or Canons now in force, or to enact any new Canon or Canons in connection with or to give effect to what has been agreed, notice of such amendment or of such new Canon or Canons shall be given for the ensuing meeting of Synod above mentioned.

The Archbishop, the Chancellor, and the Clerical Secretary have executed a memorandum in reference to the matter of stipend of the Coadjutor Bishop, and the same is submitted herewith.

INDENTURE.

THIS INDENTURE made the fifteenth day of May, 1900,

Between

THE MOST REVEREND JOHN TRAVERS LEWIS, ARCHBISHOP OF ONTARIO,
Of the First Part,

—And—

THE INCORPORATED SYNOD OF THE DIOCESE OF ONTARIO,
Of the Second Part,

Witnesseth that whereas the said party of the first part is desirous, in consequence of his age and infirmity, of having a Coadjutor Bishop elected by the Synod of the Diocese of Ontario, under the provisions of a Canon passed for that purpose at the thirty-fifth session of said Synod;

And whereas the said parties of the second part, as trustees, hold certain funds in trust for the support of the Bishop of the Diocese of Ontario ;

And whereas it is necessary to provide means for the stipend of the said Coadjutor Bishop, and the said party of the first part has come to an agreement with the Executive Committee of said Synod with respect to the amount to be contributed by him to such stipend;

Therefore the said party of the first part, in consideration of the premises and of the contributions to be made by the Diocese towards the income of such Coadjutor Bishop, covenants and agrees with the said parties of the second part as follows :—

That after retaining for the said party of the first part the following sums annually, which are to be paid to him, so long as he shall continue to be the Bishop of the said Diocese, namely, the sum of one thousand four hundred dollars from the income of the Episcopal Fund, and the sum of three hundred and forty-five dollars and ninety-two cents, the latter sum representing an allowance payable and now and for many years past paid to him under what is known as the Macaulay award, the said parties of the second part shall be at liberty to apply the balance of the income of the Episcopal Fund and all other income which would or might be payable to the Bishop of said Diocese towards the stipend of the Coadjutor Bishop to be elected as aforesaid, and that the application of the said income, hereby authorized, shall take effect from the date of the consecration of the said Coadjutor Bishop, or the thirty-first day of October, 1900, whichever date shall first happen. The said parties of the second part

hereby covenant with the said party of the first part to pay to him the moneys so retained for him, and to apply the income surrendered by him as aforesaid towards the stipend of the said Coadjutor Bishop.

It is distinctly understood that the agreement embodied in this indenture has not any bearing upon or relation to the commutation allowance of the said party of the first part of six hundred dollars per annum, payable to him from the income of the Commutation Fund, generally known as the "The Clergy Trust Fund" which commutation he retains and receives as a commuted clergyman of said Diocese.

Witness the seals of the said parties respectively and the signatures of the said party of the first part, and of the Chancellor and Clerical Secretary on behalf of said parties of the second part.

2. That the arrangements made with His Grace and then reported, including the instrument as to stipend dated May 15th, 1900, and executed by His Grace and the Chancellor and Clerical Secretary, were duly approved and confirmed by the said Executive Committee; and the said sub-committee as formerly constituted was continued with the addition of certain names thereto, and with power to add to its number,—such sub-committee being authorized to take charge of all needful matters in connection with carrying out the arrangements above mentioned.

3.—REPORT OF THE MISSION BOARD.

The Mission Board begs to present to the Synod the following report for the year ended April 30th, 1900.

The Synod and the Diocese will learn with much thankfulness to God that, as the result of the appeals and efforts during the year, the direct contributions for our missionary work from all sources have exceeded those of the previous twelve months by a sum of \$1,164.44. This gratifying addition to our receipts together with the curtailing of expenditures, has enabled the Board to reduce, the amount of its indebtedness at the close of the year from \$2,648.85 to \$1,800.42.

It may be well to notice particularly, and with considerable satisfaction, the increased amount received from Parochial Collections. The Parochial Collections should be regarded as the staple source of our revenue, to be derived from regular annual subscriptions, least likely to be affected by accidental circumstances of weather or other causes of diminution to which Church services and meetings are always liable. The returns for 1899 showed the Parochial Collections to be \$2,732.70, while this year they reached the amount of \$3,605.75; a substantial increase of \$873.05. Regretting that there is still a considerable overdraft of \$1,800, the Board would earnestly beg both Clergy and Laity not to relax their efforts, so that the close of the coming year may find the Mission Fund free from the necessity of borrowing money and paying interest.

In view of the large amount of its liabilities your Board felt bound to exercise great economy during the past year. The grants were reduced (or not expended) from \$5,900.55 to \$5,127.42. Until relieved altogether of debt and interest it has been resolved to make no addition to our expenditure. Only with a surplus on hand can we safely, shall we say honestly, venture to pledge the Fund to any progressive work, however promising it may seem, in the way of subdivision of extensive Missions and the fostering of new congregations.

Changes of incumbency have taken place during the year in several Missions and deserve notice. After seven years of energetic and most praiseworthy labours in the wide mission field of Dungannon and Monteagle, the Rev. Thomas Leech has been removed to Lansdowne Front. The Mission will henceforth be divided in two, to be known as those of Bancroft and Coe Hill; and the Rev. A. H. Creeggan has been appointed to Bancroft, thus leaving Marysburg vacant, with the Mission of Coe Hill, to which no appointment has yet been made, to be filled. The Rev. C. J. Young, B.A., after eleven years of laborious and successful work at Lansdowne Front, has succeeded the Rev. F. T. Dibb at Wolfe Island, Mr. Dibb having been appointed acting Rector at Bath in place of the Rev. E. T. Evans, who removed to the Diocese of Central New York.

During the year the Diocese has, we cannot but regret to state, lost the services of the following exemplary missionary clergymen:—1. The Rev. Charles T. Lewis left Tweed for the Diocese of Quebec, his place being filled by the Rev. C. A. Ffrench, of Lombardy, to which Mission the Rev. F. G. Kirkpatrick, B.C.L., has succeeded, leaving a vacancy at Wellington. 2. The Rev. Hugh Spencer, Lic. Th., moved to the Diocese of Marquette from Stirling, which, after

much negotiation, has become united to Frankford, both congregations at present forming a strong and independent parish. 3. The Rev. Arthur H. Lord also went to the Diocese of Marquette, leaving the extensive Mission of Queensboro vacant. 4. The Rev. James Robinson, a valued missionary of thirteen years' experience, moved to the Diocese of Colorado, leaving the Mission of Pittsburg, now filled by the appointment of the Rev. David Jenkins, lately of Roslin, which remains vacant. It is to be hoped that successors to these excellent young clergymen may soon be found. Roslin with Thomasburg, Queensboro, Stirling and Frankford, Wellington, and Marysburg, are old established Missions, which should be not long left without the Church's ministrations. The existing circumstances, however, may now present an opportunity of stirring up the local Church members to greater liberality in the support of their clergymen, and so affording an evidence that they value those sacred means of grace which they have so long been privileged to enjoy by the assistance of their brethren elsewhere.

Since the above was written the Diocese has had to deplore the demise of the Rev. Richard James Harvey, Missionary at Kitley, which adds another vacancy to the above.

The following recommendations of a sub-committee appointed to consider the best method of holding missionary meetings are approved by the Board:—

1. That, so far as possible, the meetings should be held on a Sunday; or, at the least, that one Sunday meeting should be held in every parish.
2. That the meetings be held not earlier than September 1st, and not later than February 28th.
3. That the cards for Parochial Collections should be circulated first at the meeting, and that the canvass should be completed as soon afterwards as may be practicable—the deputation beginning it, when possible.
4. That two or three clergymen for each deanery should be entrusted with the work of arranging for and holding the meetings.
5. That the Committee of Rural Deans be requested to make a selection of such clergymen as they may think best suited for the purpose, and communicate with them forthwith.
6. That the Layman's Association be asked to suggest names of their brethren who will undertake to go with the clergymen and aid at the meetings.

The following classification of Missions has been recommended by your Board for the ensuing year, and is herewith submitted to the Synod for approval. The estimated amount needed to meet the requirements of our missionary operations in the Diocese is \$5,386. If to this sum be added the \$1,800 overdrawn balance, it will be necessary to have an income of \$7,186, over and above all working expenses, *if we are to meet the grants and start free of all liability in 1901.* This is a consummation devoutly to be wished. May God give us both the will and the power to accomplish it for the glory of His Name and the well being of His Church.

4.—REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON DOMESTIC AND FOREIGN MISSIONS.

The Committee on Domestic and Foreign Missions beg leave to report that the financial statement for the year ended April 30th, 1900, was presented by the Diocesan Treasurer; from which it appeared that \$1,892.67 had been contributed to the missionary work of the Church during the past twelve months. To this amount should be added the sum of \$333.55, contributed through the Woman's Auxiliary to the Alice L. Rogers memorial, which sum is to be devoted to the erection of a Nurses' Home or rooms in connection with our Hospital at Nagano. The total will thus be \$2,226.22.

It is much to be regretted that there is a decline in giving in all the Rural Deaneries except Prince Edward where the increase is about \$12.

Five parishes made no response to either the Ascensiontide or Epiphany appeal.

Canon Spencer reported the proceedings of the meeting of the General Board held in Montreal on the 25th April., and congratulated the Church upon the fact that the Board had felt justified in appointing three new missionaries to Japan, viz., Rev. R. H. McGinnis of the Diocese of Niagara, and the Rev. Charles H. Shortt and the Rev. G. Egerton Ryerson of the Diocese of Toronto.

These will leave for the Canadian missionary district in Japan early in July. This forward movement has been rendered possible in part by the generous donation of \$1,040 by the Rev. J. M. Davenport of St. John, N.B., in part by the pledge of \$500 from the Alumni Association of Trinity College, Toronto, and of a similar amount by the Corresponding Committee of the Diocese of Montreal.

The Church in Australia purposes this year holding a Jubilee of the Australian Episcopate, and some time ago invited His Grace the Primate of All Canada to represent the Canadian Church at the celebration. Archbishop Machray has, however, requested the Bishop of Nova Scotia to act as his substitute, and it is the intention of the Bishop to comply with this request, and returning by way of Japan, to make an extended visit to our Missions there. Commended to Bishop Awdry by the Canadian House of Bishops, he will have every opportunity of studying all departments of our work, and his report will be of great interest and value to the Church here.

Much regret was expressed that the "Canadian Magazine and Mission News" received such meagre support, even from the Clergy of the Dominion; and a wider and deeper interest in this, as well as in the scheme for eliciting the contributions of the children, was strongly urged.

14.—REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON THE STATE OF THE CHURCH.

The Committee on the State of the Church beg leave to report that the number of vacant Missions, and the many Clerical changes which have taken place during the year just ended, have made it somewhat difficult to obtain full and accurate returns from all parishes. Kindly assistance from various quar-

ters has, however, secured tolerably complete returns from all points save Queensboro and Pittsburg, in which cases last year's figures have as usual been resorted to. The net result for the whole Diocese is in several particulars satisfactory. Considerable gains appear in Church membership, the total population reported being 800 in excess of last year's figures. Twenty-one parishes report an increase of communicants, the most noticeable being Leeds Rear, Kingston (St. Paul's), Barriefield, and Brockville (Trinity). Our gains in some localities, however, are unfortunately more than counterbalanced by our losses elsewhere, a falling off being admitted in twenty-nine parishes. But the leakages are in general small, save in two or three instances where satisfactory explanations have been given. For the Diocese, however, the diminution in the number of communicants is 194. This temporary decline need not distress us. In truth it was almost expected by your Committee, considering the unusually large gains reported last year. With occasional unfavourable fluctuations, our communicants have increased by a thousand in the last ten years, and we shall continue to grow in the future as in the past.

Your Committee have this year followed the example of some sister Dioceses and, as a new feature, have asked for the actual number of communicants present upon Easter Day and during the Octave. They were aware that the state of the roads in rural parishes during the early April days would render this test severe and almost misrepresenting. Yet it seemed to them that no season could be selected other than that upon which alone the Church requires the attendance of all her religiously and devoutly disposed members. The outcome of replies shewed that, of 8,199 communicants, 5,000 were present during the season specified. In one case only, the Mission of Loughborough, did the Easter communicants equal the entire communicant roll of the parish. Next in order of merit came St. Peter's, Brockville; St. Paul's, Kingston; and the Cathedral: the proportion in these three being nearly equal. As an example of a largely rural parish, honourable mention may be made of Barriefield, where there are 96 communicants, of whom 85 actually received during Eastertide. By reason of our greater strength in the rural districts, as compared with the western Dioceses, we appear to somewhat less advantage than Toronto or Huron in this particular. More than one-half of the communicants in the Diocese of Toronto reside in the See City, namely, 10,858; and of these no less than 9,327 communicated upon Easter Day, 1898. Apart from the city, there are in the Diocese 9,252 communicants, and of these the actual Easter recipients were 5,678. The considerable number of large towns in the western peninsula gives the Diocese of Huron a corresponding advantage. But considering the circumstances, our figures need not at all shame us, although we must be constrained to feel that the joy of attending upon the Holy Communion is by many imperfectly realized.

In the number of our various public services a shrinkage appears. Only the mid-day celebrations have increased. But for the rest the decline is mainly confined to two or three parishes where unfavourable circumstances temporarily prevail.

There are few changes worthy of note in the other departments of our work, save in the matter of finance where, for erection and purchase, the sum expended is \$21,000 more than last year. But it should be explained that three-fourths of the entire amount (\$33,000) has been expended in the restoration of the Cathedral, which now, thank God, reappears in enhanced dignity and beauty, and will, we trust, soon be reopened for worship. In the other three columns there is a gain of \$5,224, exclusive of contributions to the Diocesan Augmentation Fund, which have been reported in but one or two instances.

The total value of Church property is now \$691,000. Upon this the insurance carried is \$276,730. Making allowance for a certain proportion of land values, it is still affirmed by good business men that the amount of insurance upon buildings should be increased.

A most satisfactory state of affairs, however, is brought to light by the answers received to the question (proposed this year for the first time) as to the amount of debt upon Church property. No less than thirty parishes report no incumbrance whatever. As to eleven more, less than \$500 rests upon each, and the total indebtedness of the Diocese is less than \$50,000. This is indeed exclusive of the liabilities of the Cathedral, which are not exactly obtainable at present, but will, no doubt, form the largest in the Diocese. Yet who will say that this debt has not been worthily contracted in the erection of a temple second to none in the Dominion in chaste and imposing appearance. But to say that two-thirds of our congregations are unembarrassed financially is simply to accentuate the assurances received from other quarters as to the sound condition of the temporalities of the Diocese at large, and should encourage us to hope that soon again we shall be able to lengthen our cords to break forth on the right hand and on the left, and to win new victories for our Lord.

15.—REPORT OF THE BOARD OF RURAL DEANS, A.D. 1900.

The Board of Rural Deans beg to submit herewith the reports forwarded by the several Rural Deaneries.

I.—RURAL DEANERY OF FRONTENAC.

The Rural Dean of Frontenac reports that the only vacant Mission is Pittsburg. In the other Missions are to be found good, hard working, faithful and true Missionaries. Temporal affairs are good, and the increased activity shown in working the mines in the northern part of the Deanery suggests future improvement in finances with a growing population. *Sharbot Lake* Mission has become more workable since Maberly was taken off. A new Church is being built at *Arden*, on the C. P. R. Rev. Mr. Wilkinson has started a parish magazine. At *Sydenham* the Rev. W. P. Reeve has improved the parsonage at a cost of \$1,100. Placed a stone wall, with iron gates, around the grounds. *Murvale* suffers the loss of a faithful parishioner in the death of James Murton, who a few years ago rebuilt the church at his own cost. *Wolfe Island* has been placed in charge of the Rev. C. J. Young, a worthy successor to the Rev. F. T. Dobb.

The Rev. R. W. Rayson, of All Saints' Kingston, has been absent from his parish for some time on sick leave. The Rev. Canon Spencer acted as his *locum tenens*. The Rural Dean of Frontenac, on resigning his position as Rural Dean and Chairman of the Board of Rural Deans, would express his deep regret at having to resign his position on being appointed to the office of Archdeacon, and thanks his brother Rural Deans for the kindly way in which they have always, during sixteen years, co-operated with him in furthering the Church's work.

2.—RURAL DEANERY OF GRENVILLE.

St. James' Congregation, *Maitland*, has liquidated a debt of \$100 incurred by placing a furnace in the Rectory. *St. George's* paid a debt on their Church. *Lord's Mills* have fenced and put their Church yard in order. The Mission Board grant saved the Mission from becoming extinct. *Cardinal* reports services well attended; observance of Lent improved; number of communicants increased. *Kemptville* lost lately ten young persons, mostly Sunday School teachers, who left to fill important situations in New York, Chicago, Ottawa, Rossland, and other places. The Woman's Auxiliary sent their usual bale to the North-West. St. James' Sunday School sent five large boxes and a bale of clothes, together with money to assist the sufferers from the late fire in Ottawa. The congregation introduced electric light into their Parish Church at the cost of \$175, and a furnace costing \$70, and have spent \$30 in cleaning the Church yard. St. James' Sunday School have added \$50 worth of books to their library. Work gradually maturing. Ladies of St. John's Guild, *Oxford Mills*, presented a handsome white stole to their Rector, Mr. Forsythe, and placed a suitable carpet on the sanctuary floor. A visit from the Rural Dean resulted in an enlargement of Clergyman's stipend. The ladies of *St. Augustine's* furnished their Church with a beautiful organ. The ladies of St. Ann's, *Oxford Station*, have raised money to improve their Church. The three congregations combined and placed an excellent furnace in the Rectory. This Parish has suffered financially from the death and migration of faithful subscribers.

The new Rector of Merrickville, Mr. Forneri, found that his predecessor, Mr. Roberts, had during his Incumbency reduced the debt of \$2,000 on the Rectory to \$200. His work, previous to his departure, had been gratefully acknowledged by the presentation of a costly fur coat, and a purse of \$80, whilst the faithful services of his daughter, as organist, had been recognized by the presentation of a well filled purse. Mr. Forneri speaks of improvements being continued in the Parish, and flourishing Sunday Schools, and addition of books to S. S. Libraries. *Prescott* laments a large departure of parishioners; but hopes that an important new industry about to be established there will yield new parishioners from among the employees. The Sunday School continues to improve. "W.A." have done good work, having raised more than \$90. "Church Woman's Guild" has worked well, having raised \$350 for parochial work. A handsome brass tablet has been placed in the Church by the administrator (F. J. French, Q.C.) of the "Gainford Fund," to keep in memory the pious donors

to Church work. *North Augusta* reports—"Our work on the whole is quite satisfactory."

3.—RURAL DEANERY OF HASTINGS.

Reports the continued vacancy of Queensboro to be greatly deplored. The resignation of the Revs. A. H. Lord and T. Leech severely felt. The people are beginning to understand the necessity of providing a stated income for their Clergyman in *Dungannon and Monteagle*. A lych gate is being erected at *Bancroft* cemetery. At *Coe Hill* a fine new organ has been placed in the Church, likewise a new carpet for the steps approaching the altar, and also matting for the aisle, and lamps. The new Church at *Bird Creek* is enclosed. Debt on *Tweed* parsonage reduced. Congregation good. St. James' Church Woman's Guild doing well. Cottage lectures at *Stoco* edifying. *Madoc* flourishing. Debt on Church cleared. The Children's Guild putting a new font in the Church. The Easter services of 1900 the best in the history of the parish. On Easter Day 264 were present at service. Seventy-one communicants during the Octave. Books added to Sunday School library. Church work advancing. *Roslin*, vigorous work in many centres. A new organ placed in St. John's, *Moncymore*. *Shannonville* flourishing. Work progressing steadily at *Tyendinaga*. Debt on St. Mark's, *Deseronto*, wiped out. Communicants increasing. Sunday School flourishing. The Girls' Guild presented a violet dossal to the Church. Two ladies embroidered and presented two handsome banners to the Church. Handsome bookmarks were also given. St. Thomas, *Belleville*, is being improved. St. John's congratulates itself on the success of the "penny fund" for Diocesan Missions. Christ Church sends no report. The Rural Dean strongly urges the necessity of cutting off the stations from *Bancroft*, and the clergyman confining his labours to the town.

4.—RURAL DEANERY OF LEEDS.

All the Parishes flourishing. Clergy working hard, Laity co-operating. Increased contributions. Two Clerical changes. Rev. F. G. Kirkpatrick succeeds Rev. C. A. French; and Rev. T. Leech, Rev. C. J. Young. Ruri-Decanal Chapters have been held with good results. Church property in every direction greatly improved. A fine brick Church has been erected at Seeley's Bay and opened for service. Interior of *Newboro* Church has been beautified. In *Lansdowne Rear* a Rectory has been purchased. The Church at *Athens* improved. *Frankville* Church has been restored; a beautiful carpet placed in the sanctuary; the Rectory has been repaired. *Westport* debt decreased by \$251.50. "Absolutely necessary to form a new Mission out of *Lansdowne Front* with headquarters at *Mallorytown*."

5.—RURAL DEANERY OF LENNOX AND ADDINGTON.

The Rev. A. Jarvis succeeded the Rev. R. S. Forneri as Rural Dean November 28th, 1899. The Rev. F. T. Dibb has been appointed Curate in charge of *Bath*. At the Easter Vestry pew rents were superseded by the envelope system

to maintain current expenses of the parish. *Odessa Church* is being repaired. Still \$300 mortgage on the Church. *Camden East* is involved in a loss to Clergyman's stipend of \$125 per annum on account of *Napanee Mills* being detached from it. At *St. Luke's* (Parish Church) \$409, principal and interest, paid on Church debt; balance, \$1,160, towards which \$300 subscribed. *Yarker* averages \$2.25 per family towards the Mission Fund. Rev. C. J. Hutton succeeded in adding \$1,135 to Diocesan Augmentation Fund by subscriptions, a third of which has been paid. The Rural Dean considers that *North Addington* has the strongest claims on the Diocese for help, especially from the earnest efforts of the two missionaries to make up for past neglect of the Church, and, secondly, because of the great poverty of the people. During the year fifty children were baptized, and five Sunday Schools sustained. Debt on the Church at *Flinton* has been reduced to \$1,130. *Mr. Wright* serves six stations with great energy and zeal. *Selby* gives \$1,350 towards Diocesan Augmentation Fund. *Tamworth* is in an exceedingly healthy condition. Congregations good. Communicants increasing. *St. Matthew's, Marlbank*, restored. A brass altar rail placed by Miss L. Allen in memory of her father. An excellent shed has been built at the Church. Subscribed \$1,200 to Diocesan Augmentation Fund; a third part has been paid in. A successful branch of "W. A." has been started at *Adolphustown*. *Napanee* reports extensive repairs on the Church. Sale of Rectory, proceeds going towards purchasing a new one convenient to the Church. Mr. Wm. Miller promises \$1,000 towards the Church on certain conditions. Floating debt of \$400 wiped out. Subscribed \$1,605 to Diocesan Augmentation Fund; about \$600 paid in. Daily prayers at 9 a.m. in the Chapel.

6.—RURAL DEANERY OF PRINCE EDWARD.

The Rural Dean reports that "the work of the Church has been carried on continuously and successfully." The difficulties *in re Frankford and Stirling* ought to be settled as soon as possible. The Rev. Mr. Geen has rendered good service in vacant parishes. The offerings to the Mission Fund have been greatly increased during the past year. The grants made to the different Missions should be continued, and a grant of \$100 is urgently asked in favour of *Rawdon*.
