CHILDREN'S DAY OFFERINGS

The Rev. J. C. Popey, Secretary Treasurer of the Algoma Sunday School Committee, acknowledges the receipt of the following sums for the work of the General Board of Religious Education, being the collections on Children's Day (October 21st) for Sunday School work:

Sudbury, \$15.00; North Bay, \$10.96; Rosseau, \$10.20; St. Paul's, Fort William, \$10.00; St. Luke's, Fort William, \$8.00; St. John's, Port Arthur, \$4.50; Gravenhurst, \$4.00; Thessalon, \$4.00; Schreiber, \$3.00; Dorion, \$2.86; Copper Cliff, \$2.50; Byng Inlet, \$2.10; New Liskeard, \$1.90; Richards' Landing, \$1.80; South River, \$1.68; Gore Bay, \$1.00; Hilton Beach, .40; Milford Bay, .25.

A disappointing feature of the above list is the absence of by far the greater number of the parishes and missions of the Diocese. The total amount received is \$74.15. The sum which the Diocese is asked to raise is \$400.00. Had every parish and mission responded (as all are bound to do according to Canon 21 of our Synod) perhaps we should not have come far short of our objective. We trust the Diocese may make a better showing in 1924.

The many friends of Archdeacon Gillmor will be grieved to learn that he has been ill. Thanks to the good care he is receiving at the Plummer Memorial Hospital at the Sault he is progressing favourably. We all hope and pray that he may soon be restored to his accustomed health.

The Rev. T. H. Young, Rector of St. James' Church, Cobalt, has been appointed to a Rectory in Tampa, Florida, and leaves for the South about the middle of February.

The Rev. H. F. Cocks of Little Current has been appointed to the Mission of Webbwood and Espanola, and is to take charge in February. Mr. Cocks will live at Espanola.

We welcome to the Diocese the Rev. C. B. Harris who comes to us from the Diocese of Niagara. Mr. Harris has been recently engaged in mission work along the new Welland canal, now in course of construction. After a few weeks spent at Espanola, Mr. Harris has come to Sault Ste. Marie, where he is in charge of St. Peter's and Tarentorus during the Archdeacon's illness.

Owing to the large amount of official matter necessarily printed in this issue, a few items of news kindly sent in have to be held over till the February number.

On the Feast of the Epiphany His Grace the Archbishop completed the twenty-seventh year of his episcopate. That all these fruitful years of faithful service have been spent in Algoma is a cause of thankfulness to the people of the diocese and its many friends beyond its borders. May His Grace long be spared to enjoy the love and esteem of his people.

CONSECRATION OF THE CHURCH OF THE EPIPHANY, SUDBURY

The Feast of the Epiphany was a happy day for the Church people of the Parish of Sudbury, for it was the day on which their splendid church was solemnly consecrated and set apart for ever for the worship of Almighty God.

In spite of a cold stormy day, the services were all very well attended. There was a celebration of Holy Communion at 8 o'clock, at which the Rector, the Rev. P. F. Bull was celebrant, the Rev. C. B. Harris reading the Epistle, and the Rev. Canon Boydell the Gospel. His Grace the Archbishop was present and pronounced the Absolution and Benediction.

The Consecration of the Church was carried out in accordance with the form provided in the Canadian Prayer Book. At 10.30 the wardens, Messrs. J. H. Davies and H. C. Duncan, with the clergy and choir, entered the church from the vestry and proceeded to the front entrance. Here the procession was met by His Grace the Archbishop, who was accompanied by the Rev. J. Norman, acting as his chaplain. The petition of the congregation for the consecration of the church was read, presented by the wardens and accepted by His Grace; then the procession advanced to the chancel singing Psalm 24. Having reached the sanctuary, the petition and title deeds were laid on the altar, and the prescribed prayers were offered by the Archbishop. The Rector, at the Archbishop's request, read the sentence of consecration, which His Grace then signed and ordered to be recorded in the Registry of the Diocese.

The Order of Morning Prayer then followed to the end of the Benedictus, the lessons being read by the Rev. C. B. Harris and the Rev. Canon Boydell. Then followed the service of Holy Communion, at which the Archbishop was celebrant, the Rev. J. Norman and the Rev. C. B. Harris being epistoler and gospeller respectively.

In his sermon His Grace expressed his pleasure that the congregation had been able to free the church of debt, and now to offer it to God for His glory and worship. He referred to the splendid work which had been accomplished in the past by the several incumbents of the parish,—by the Rev. Charles (now Canon) Piercy, who came as the first incumbent on the 31st of May, 1890, and through whose efforts the first church was erected; the Rev. W. H. Franch, the Rev. F. C. H. Ulbricht, and others who

carried on from time to time; and the Rev. Canon Boydell whose successful efforts, with the loyal co-operation of the people, had resulted in the erection of the present fine church. Consecration, His Grace pointed out, was the giving of the building to God for His service. That which is thus given cannot be taken back, nor can it be used for any other purpose. The church now consecrated is a Temple of God.

At the Confirmation Service at 3 o'clock, thirty-five persons were presented by the Rector for the apostolic rite.

The evening service followed the usual order. The lessons were read by the Rev. Canon Boydell and the Rev. J. Norman. The Rev. C. B. Harris read the prayers, and the Rev. C. C. Simpson acted as Archbishop's chaplain.

His Grace was also the preacher at this service. He spoke of the difference between dedication and consecration. The church was dedicated to the Epiphany, or the Manifestation of our Lord to the Gentiles; and therefore the congregation should be essentially a missionary one,—every member true to the Church, living in the spirit of the name of their church, helping to make Christ known to the world. His Grace paid a tribute to the work of Canon Boydell, who for twenty years was Rector of the parish, and still, at the age of eighty-six participates in the services. His Grace made reference to the work of the present Rector, who during his first eight months' in the parish, with the co-operation of the women of the parish and the church organizations and the liberal support of the people generally, had succeeded in having the church debt removed.

The Anglican mission of Sudbury was opened thirty-four years ago, with many of the present supporters of the church as pioneer members. In 1893 the first church was erected on the site of the present edifice. The church of that day was a small frame building, but it sheltered the congregation until 1912. Then the growing congregation, under the leadership of Canon Boydell, decided to erect a new building, and in 1913 the church was opened for public worship. Canon Boydell continued in charge until the appointment of the Rev. P. A. Paris in 1918. After some years of earnest and successful work, Mr. Paris was followed by the present Rector.

PRESENTATION TO THE REV. G. H. PHILLIPS

On the evening of Friday, October 19th, about sixty persons representing the congregations of Webbwood, Espanola and Nairn, gathered in the club rooms of the Masonic Hall at Espanola, to say "Good-bye" to the Rev. G. H. Phillips, and to wish him "God-speed" in his new work at Burk's Falls.

After a social hour the company sat down to a bountiful supper, provided by the ladies of the three congregations. This was followed by addresses by Mr. F. R. Wilks of Espanola, Mr. Brathwaite of Webbwood, and Mr. Harry Smith of Nairn, expressing on behalf of their respective congregations the regret felt at the departure of Mr. and Mrs. Phillips. Each address was accompanied by a purse presented with the very best wishes of the congregation, and each was fittingly acknowledged by Mr. Phillips. It was a matter of regret that the stormy weather prevented the people from Worthington being present as they intended to be. The evenings proceedings showed clearly the place which Mr. Phillips has won in the hearts of those among whom he has laboured.

CAPREOL

St. Alban's Sunday School, Capreol, held a very successful entertainment in Mr. Plexman's new theatre, on New Year's Day, at 2.30 p.m. The theatre was almost filled to capacity with members of the congregation and their friends.

The concert began with a procession from the back of the theatre to the stage, the children singing the hymn, "We are marching on with shield and banner bright." The procession was led by one of the small boys bearing the Sunday School banner.

On the stage the children sang a Christmas carol as the opening number. The programme consisted of drills, songs, piano solos, plays, readings, and finally a visit by Santa Claus, who presented each child with a little token. A silver collection was taken, amounting to \$16.00.

Mr. Plexman very kindly gave the use of the theatre free of charge, and this entertainment was the first use made of the new building. The teachers of the Sunday School are to be congratulated on the success of their work in training the children.

The Missanabie Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary has made one of its members, Mrs. B. Nolan, a diocesan life member. The splendid work of this branch, which is composed entirely of Indian women, is a matter of pride to all interested in W. A. work in the diocese.
