Mr Buckles Encountered has on Intering the siver, in the Mission boat, which caused two large holes in the bow of the boat, which sapede filled with water. Mr Bucklee became Excited and sured to the bow, then toppled over into the cold water and was drowned before help arrived. He was buried in the Church Cemetry at Gregory on Wesday, Dec. 11, 1923.

April 25, 1924 Cyril G. J. Stone, Student in Charge, came from Drinty bollege, Toronto. The musion was without administration from the time of the Mr Buelle's death, on Dec. 9, 1923 until april 25th 1924. Tanze debto had accumulated amounting to over Egit hundre dollars (this amount includes a mostgage on the Parsonage of \$4000 made during the Indemberer of Rev. 6. 7 L. Gilbert to emplete the Church). The Incorner of the Church Mr J. R. ancioens held a cash balance of \$383 and a postage stomp, three cents, to offset the debt. On the arrival of someone to take thange, the annual vestry meeting was held, and the people promised to help as much as possible to clear up the debt. Various actuaties were Engaged in during the themmer, which were splendedly backed by the people. All debts were paid and the Mortgage was reduced by one Lundred dollars. In closing these remarks I cannot omit to mention the help received from the young People's association of At. Philips Church, Toronto, who, at their own seperal came and assested no in our work on several occasions.
