Dear Mr. Brault:

The Indian Affairs Branch has requested that we give consideration to allowing the sewage from the Indian Residential School at Moose Factory to be disposed of through the sewage disposal system of the hospital.

Mr. A. H. Perry of the Public Health Engineering Branch inspected the present sewage disposal system in the residential school last year when there was an outbreak of typhoid fever and made this recommendation.

We would expect the department of Mines and Resources to be responsible for any additional costs involved. It may also be possible to request Indian Affairs Branch to bear a share of the costs of the power house construction. Possibly next year's Estimates will be soon enough to ask them for funds regarding this.

As of noon to-day seventy pupils were confined to bed with influenza. Some of the staff are affected and off duty. Classroom activities have been suspended. There are numerous cases of the ailment in the non-school population. The fire last Saturday destroyed a large part of the drugs necessary for treatment, but emergency supplies have been obtained.

The lay-out of the school does not lend itself to convenient isolation and care of the sick.

To begin with, the dormitories are nobulated well beyond the limit indicated in Departmental regulations. In the girls' dormitory there is one basin with taps and one flush toilet. In the boys' dormitory there was a like installation, but the toilet has been out of order for a long time.

Food has to be carried from the basement kitchen up two stories, and there is not, of course, a supplyeof trays adequate for such an emergency with the natural result that there is a good deal of inconvenience and considerable mess.

The situation affords a pathetic contrast with the infirmary at Prince Albert which has flexible accommodation for both sexes, adequate plumbing, and a convenient dispensary; also equipment and other provision for serving food at the proper temperature.

It has been in my mind for some time to recommend that the Moose Fort Residential School restrictives activities to those of a hostel, and that a separate building be provided for classroom purposes and recreational, physical and vocational training. There is a growing population on this island, both Indian and non-Indian, which already overtaxes the day school accommodation which the Moose Fort building can provide. Additional dormitory space is needed in the residential school where one dormitory has been converted into a third sub-standard classroom. It should be restored to its original function. Other uses could well be found for the two actual classrooms if a building of adequate size were available for school and community purposes.
