

REVIEW OF BOOK II

Suitability for Grades V and VI

METHOD OF STUDY:

The method of study introduced in the speller is easily followed and interesting to the pupils. My pupils enjoy reading the short stories in each exercise and finding the new words in these stories.

DICTIONARY:

The dictionary is the most interesting and productive feature in this book. Pupils soon began to consult it, without being told, for meanings and pronunciation.

HOW YOUR WORDS:

This feature is unbeatable for correlating spelling and English. It helps the pupils to read ideas instead of words. They get a clearer understanding of words when they learn how a word is made up. The type of questions in this exercise help develop the pupil's reasoning powers.

CORRELATIONS AND PUPIL INTEREST:

Because of the wide range of topics in this book, spelling can be correlated with every subject in the course of studies. I have found it especially useful in paragraph study and story telling.

RESULTS IN SPELLING:

Using your progress chart I have found a great improvement in the pupils ability not only to spell the words correctly but also to use the words correctly.



MODERN TRENDS: In this regard the text appears perfectly sound. The choice of words is adapted to, and chosen from the activities of our stream-lined age. The fact that pupils choose words from the paragraph and incidentally gain a knowledge of their meaning is in keeping with "learn by doing" philosophy of Ed.

PEDAGOGICAL METHOD:

Much to be commended as it makes use of problem motivation....The "KNOW YOUR WORDS SECTION" of the lesson unit, perhaps a letter too long, gives the pupil skill in the application of his new words. The derivation of new words from root words, the study of vowels, diphthongs and consonants, is to be highly commended. The differently stressed syllables on "desert" (noun) and desert (verb) develop skill in knowledge and use of words.

DIVISION OF WORK

Since each unit is meant to cover one week, this is rather an underestimate of ability of each child of normal age and grade. Two to three days with an active class could cover each unit.

SUITABILITY TO PRESENT ONT. COURSE.

The vocabulary is not the same as is used in the modern Ont. Course as now outlined. A careful study of five years HIGH SCHOOL ENTRANCE PAPERS (based on Ont. Speller) shows that out of approximately 500 words asked on those papers with about a 70% frequency each year, 80 to 100 of these words were not listed at all.

OMISSIONS:

The names of the Days of the Week, and Months of the Year; with some of their difficulties, should have been inserted. Certain common abbreviations and names of nationalities, and organizations would have been valuable.

CORRELATION:


The choice of vocabulary taken from science, progress, transportation, art, history, and sports, etc. is excellent.

CONCLUSION:

The text as a whole is excellent for a supplementary text book, but not as a preparatory daily text for the Ont. H.S. Entrance examinations.

Dear Father Oliver:

I have finally reached Ottawa and have consulted our files in reference to school supplies that were requisitioned for delivery to the Spanish School.

On checking with the Department of Public Printing and Stationery they advised me that almost all of the supplies have been forwarded. Any outstanding items will be reaching you shortly.

While at Spanish I discussed general school problems with the different teachers and I made a number of notes on the requirements that the teachers brought to my attention. However, on going over my notes I find that I have my notes on the boys and girls schools confused. I am preparing one requisition for action by the Department of Public Printing and Stationery and I am sending it in care of the boys school, therefore, I would appreciate it if on receipt of these supplies you would arrange to distribute them as required.


The Supplementary readers, language books, black cover No. 288, typewriter paper, writing pads, marking ink are for the boys school. The Social Studies readers, ink wells, map of the world, duplicators, brushes, and blackboards are for the girls school. I am also forwarding fifteen hectograph workbooks. These are workbooks that should be used for the primary grades in both schools as they are adaptable by means of tearing out a page and running off the necessary copies.
