The principal asks the Department to study this problem and supply the number of cows that it will be necessary for the school to buy.

Receipt is acknowledged of your letter dated the 29th ultimo, file 465-14(EL) in commection with quantity of milk obtained from the dairy herd at this school.

At the present time only 4 cows are milking, and three will freshen in the next two months. These four produce eight gallons of milk daily. This eight gallons of plus ten gallons of whole powdered milk is served to the pupils each day.

The average consumption per pupil is 1.4 pints
