Dear Sir,

Enclosed please find fiscal statement for the September quarter.

As instructed, I have listed all accounts outstanding. The total, less balance on hand, \$1618.78. The balance of per capita grant due is \$4156.08 which will leave me with \$2537.30 as at the beginning of the quarter. At the same date last year there remained of the per capita grant \$462.02. This year, therefore, shows an improvement of \$2075.28. During the year I have received from New England Company grant \$2250.00 so that it would appear that I have used for the conduct of the school the per capita grant plus \$174.72 from the New England Company grant. On the other hand I have paid a number of accounts for major repairs which normally have been chargeable to these funds, viz. Roofing the gardener's cottage (material only) \$107.00 Roofing material for the whole new wing, i.e. pupils' diningroom and the section between it and the main school, \$172.85, a new coil for hot water heater \$125.00, new cream separator \$150.00, plumbing and alterations necessary to make the boiler function properly, \$173.54. Total, \$728.39. Major Randle was consulted re these repairs.

It is plain, therefore, that, in spite of rising costs, the current expenses have been kept well within the per capita grant. I trust that this record will give to you satisfaction and assurance that the utmost care and economy consistent with efficiency has been exercised.

However, the Department will appreciate that the costs of everything have risen in the past two years, and of course the quarter just ending and the previous quarter are the most expensive in the year, being the winter months.

It is also desirable to say that during the Principal's absence and while this office was in charge, no expenses were authorized or incurred other than those of routine nature, such as food, etc., so that this office was not in any way responsible for the lack of funds on hand, and except for paying salaries and two or three special accounts, most of the settlement of outstanding accounts was left until Mr. Snell's return.

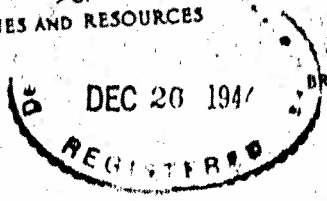

Dear Sir:

Having completed three months as acting Medical Officer to the Mohawk Institute, I beg leave to draw your attention to some of the medical and hygienic conditions that have come to my notice.

I am happy to inform you that my relations with the Principal and Matron have been most cordial, and that I have received the utmost cooperation from all members of the Staff.

In my opinion the general health of the pupils has been very good, with a notable absence of respiratory infections.

Forty cases were referred to Lady Willingdon Hospital during this period. They consisted of 36 cases for removal of Tonsils and Adenoids; 2 cases of Acute Rheumatic Fever; and 2 cases of Interstitial Keratitis found to be Wassermann positive and requiring anti-syphilitic treatment.

Two cases of Vincent's Stomatitis were referred to Dr. Bradley Linscott for dental treatment.

Several cases of Impetigo Contagiosa were found and cleared up readily with sulphathiazole ointment.

General inspections of all buildings were made and many unsatisfactory conditions were found.

Dishes were being washed in soapy water too infrequently changed, and dried with none too clean dish towels. It was recommended that they be scraped clean, washed in soapy water, rinsed in clear water, dipped in HTH 15 solution and dry racked.

Roller hand towels were found to be in use in the pupils' wash rooms. On several occasions they were found to be very dirty and unsanitary. In my opinion they should be discarded and paper towels provided.

It was found that the female pupils are using cloth sanitary napkins which are washed in the school laundry. It is strongly recommended that they be dispensed with, and disposable sanitary pads be supplied instead.

There are no seats or tables in the boys' recreation room. It is suggested that barrack room benches and tables might be obtained for this purpose.

Flour and sugar were found stored in bags and exposed to mice. It was recommended that such commodities be purchased in one bag quantities and kept in covered metal containers.

Bread was found kept in open baskets, exposed to flies and mice. It was recommended that screened open shelves be built for storing bread.

In my opinion the refrigeration space is presently very inadequate, and the equipment is not in good working order.

There is no ice available to cool milk at the dairy, and insufficient refrigeration space for its storage.

The outbuildings are infested with rats, and the Brant County Health Unit has been consulted regarding means to eradicate this menace.

It is hoped that arrangements can be made to carry out the above mentioned recommendations without undue delay.



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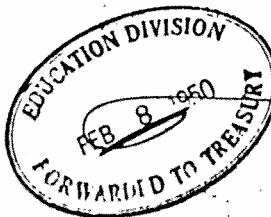
