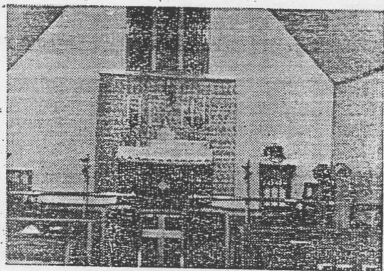

FOREWARD

IT IS WITH GREAT PLEASURE THAT WE PRESENT THIS SOUVENIR OF ALL SAINTS CHURCH. IF OMISSIONS OR ERRORS HAVE OCCURED, THEN SUCH ARE DEEPLY REGRETTED. ALL SAINTS CHURCH, WHITE RIVER, WAS CONSECRATED IN NOVEMBER, 1904, BY BISHOP THORNLOE. IN 1904, THE LAND WHERE THE PRESENT CHURCH STANDS WAS GIVEN BY C.P.R. AND THROUGH THE EFFORTS OF MR.& MRS. ISAAC COTTOM, MR.&MRS. J. LINKLATER, MR.&MRS. HUGH WILLOUGHAN, MR.& MRS. CRYSLER, MR.& MRS. BARKER, THE CHURCH WAS BUILT IN THE SAME YEAR AT A COST OF \$625. MRS. J.LINKLATER IS STILL LIVING & ATTENDS SERVICES OCCASIONALLY.

IN WHITE RIVER, THE FIRST ANGLICAN SERVICES WERE HELD IN THE FORESTERS HALL IN 1887 BY THE REV. MACHIN. WHEN THE BUILDING WAS DESTROYED BY FIRE IN 1902, THE ANGLICAN CONGREGATION HELD THEIR SERVICES IN THE STATION LUNCHROOM. ON MAY 1, 1906, WHITE RIVER JOINED THE PARISH OF MISSANABIE. REV.S.H. FERRIS WAS APPOINTED MISSIONARY BY BISHOP THORNLOE. THE FIRST BAPTISM WAS CELEBRATED IN SEPT. 1906. THE FIRST CONFIRMATION SERVICE WAS CELEBRATED IN JUNE, 1907.
