PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE



During this school term we periodically wrote examinations to test our skills and progress. We remember that good feeling of having done well.

I am thinking now of some important tests of this year which were neither academic, practical, recreational or social. Valuable as these "stepping stones" are to our growth, I have in mind tests of character. Tests that show us what we are, not just what we do.

On December 6, 1978, our shop/gymnasium building burned to the ground. Both teachers and students scored high on the tests of flexibility (ability to change), ingenuity (skilful planning), and co-operation (working together). Shop was set up in a very adequate building about one-half kilometre distant, and we creatively made do with limited equipment for several weeks. I heard not one complaint all year about the longer trek to shop class. Loss of the gym affected every person here. I have been encouraged by our resourceful use of what we do have.

You senior students with Miss Zehr faced the test of self-discipline in practising daily for the fine programme presented on our educational tour. Your effort was most commendable and you are richer for it.

It is not easy being away from your families from January to June. Because you persisted (continued on) you passed the test of perseverance. Your determination to reach your goals kept you looking ahead.

There is yet one basic test which lies at the very foundation of our character. A person may have a brilliant, well-trained mind, but if you cannot trust his word he is poor, poor indeed. I challenge you to face the test of honesty -- with self, others and your Creator.

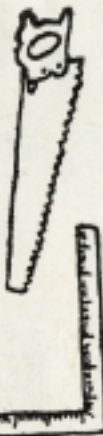
Our carpentry project this year was building an apartment in one end of a shop located one-half kilometer from the school. The other part of the building has been our shop since the gym/shop burned.
