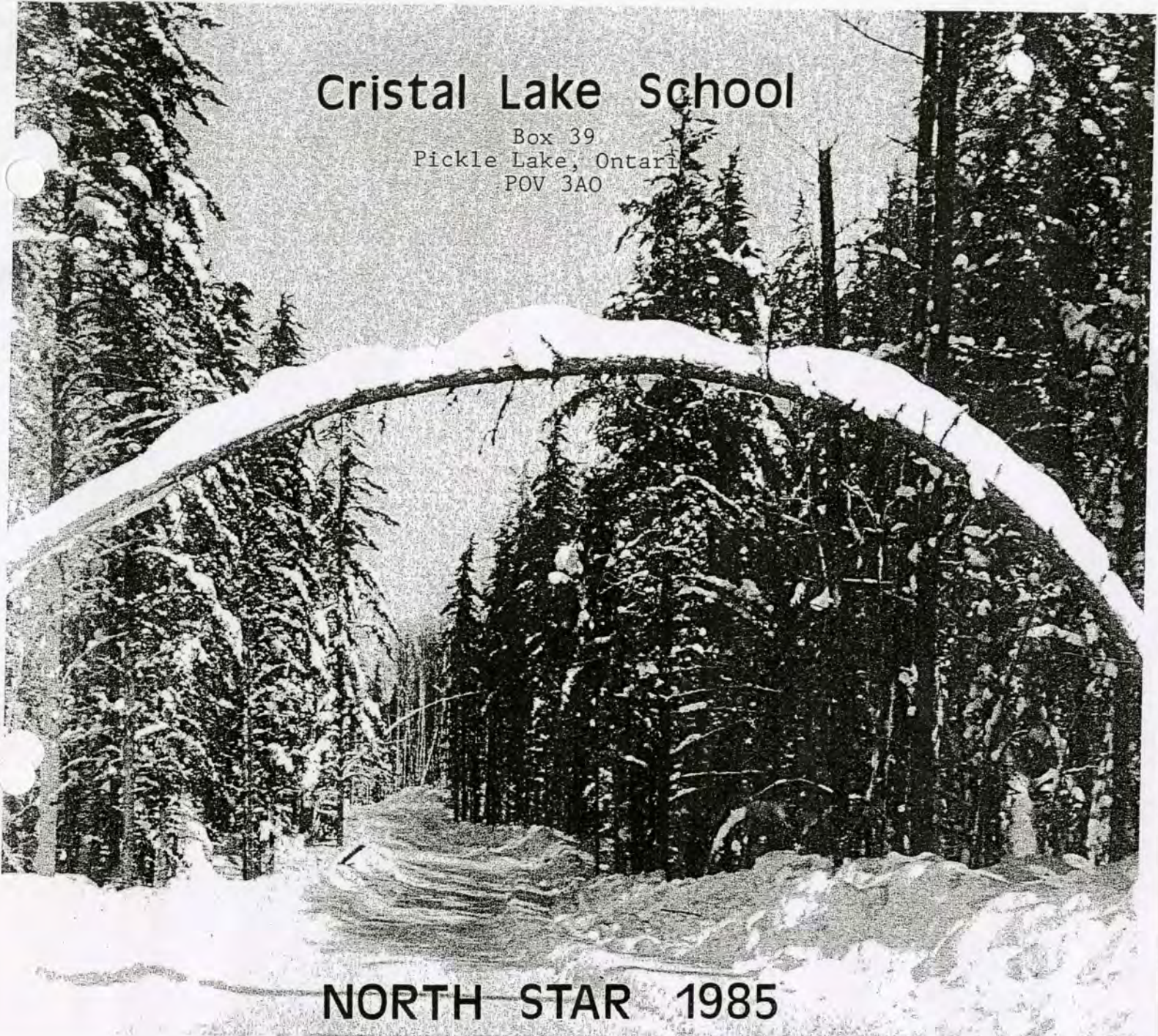

And to you, Miss Myrna, a young woman dedicated to serving her people.



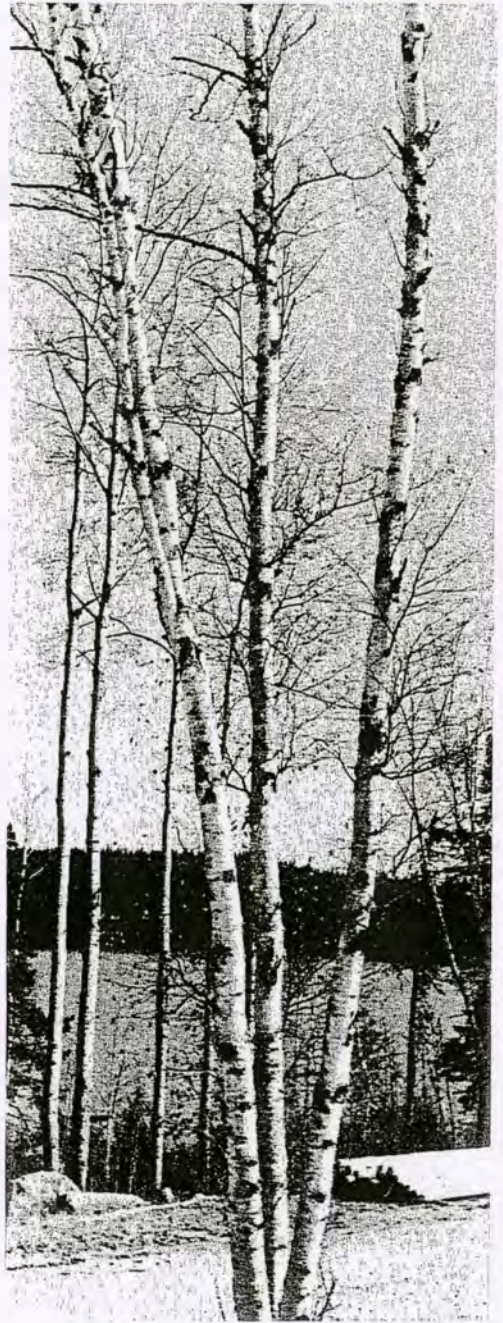
Time has a way of changing us . . .
