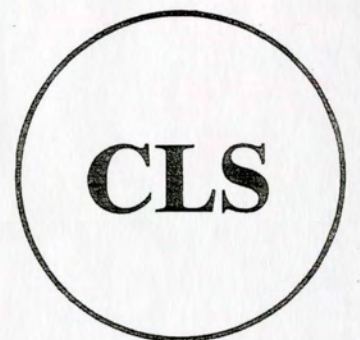

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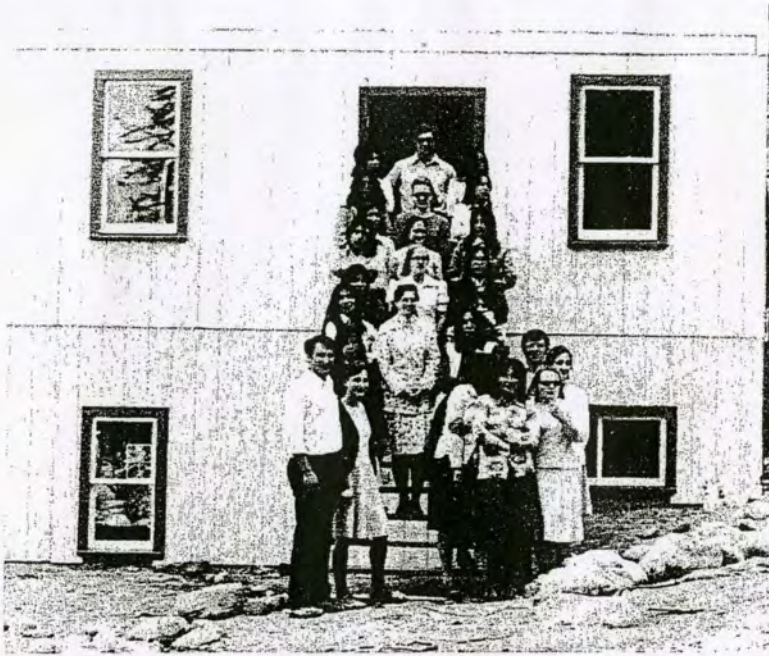
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DEDICATION

The purpose of weekend activities is to provide a break from classroom routine. Students and staff enjoy times of fun and relaxation together.



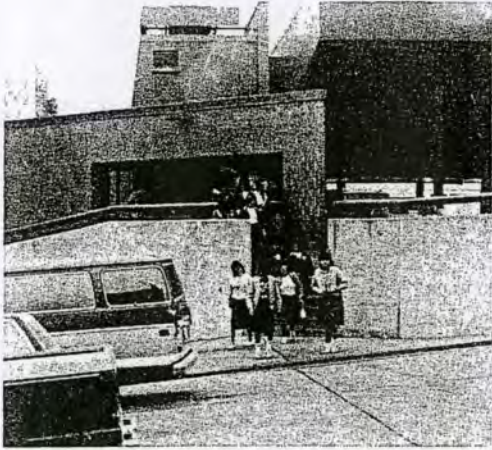
DORM LIFE





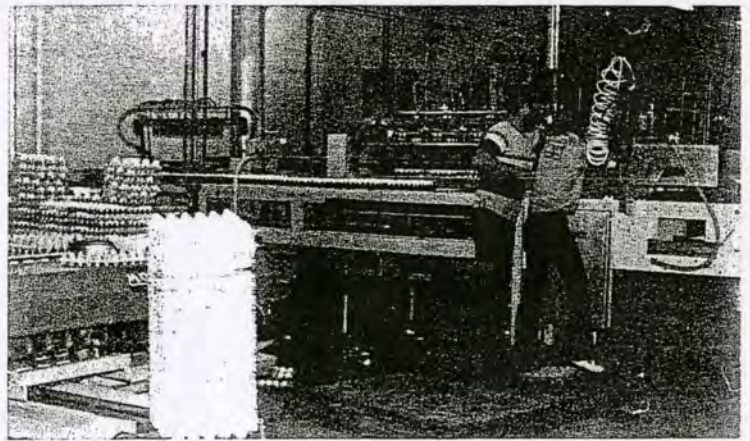
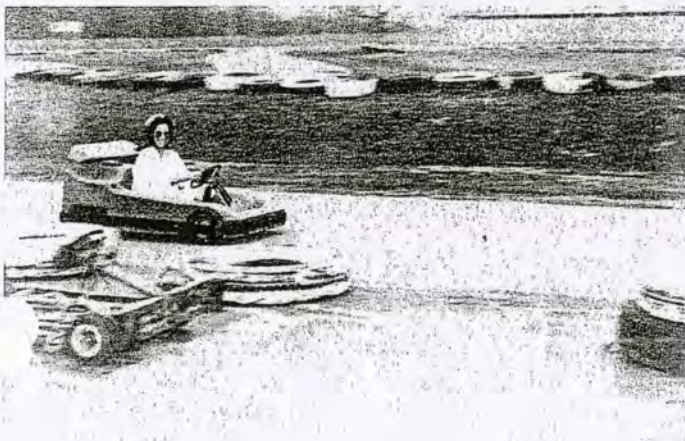
Building relationships with "sisters" who used to be strangers, blending personalities, solving problems, creating friendships that may last a lifetime, is all a part of dorm life at CLS.

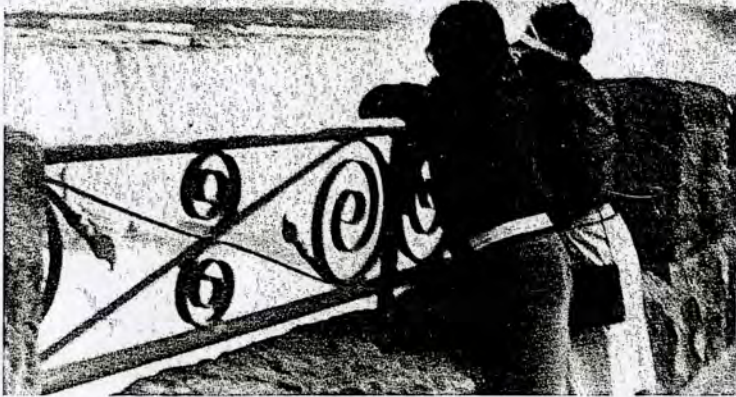
CLASS TRIP
