Wikwemikong - Printing Press

A first attempt was made at printing in 1855. It was a wonderful feat of Brother Jennessaux, who fashioned with little blocks of wood, all the types necessary to print in large letters two big books for the use of the singers. Later, in 1859, Father Hanipaux bought at the cost of twenty-five dollars a small handpress, to print hymns and prayers for the use of the Sodalties. The work done was not handsome, but quite readable and very useful.

The press was still working in March 1878 under Rev. Probst.
Aug 29, 1883 Rev. H. has good success in printing the calendar for 1883

Begins: March 1, 1903

(written in Ojibwa until 1906
and then is ~~kept~~ in French)

Goes to July 31, 1913 - the year the schools were
transferred to Spanish.

In the same volume: the Spanish Prefects' diary
begins Aug. 1, 1913 (by Jos. Couture, S.J.,
then scholastic-regent).

The last entry of this Wik.-Span. diary is
Aug. 31, 1919.
