Research of Spanish River Reserve


- - In regard to your research of the Spanish River Reserve, we are enclosing a copy of a Return showing some population figures of Manitoulin Island, made by Superintendent Ironside in 1861.

- - We are also enclosing a copy of the Rules and Regulations of the Hudson's Bay Company, governing admission to research on the positive microfilms in the Public Archives of Canada.

According to the Public Archives, permission must be obtained to view the microfilms prior to 1870 as well as after 1870.
