This historical spot is a sa= cred one for the Society of Jesus When the Jesuit Missions aroong the Jurons had attained such proportions that 10 or 1 ? missionaries, under the leadership of Pr Jerome Lalemant, were neceseary, the Superiors conceived the idea of building a house more substan tial then a mere bark cabin where the Fathers could gather from time to time for temooral and apiritual oomfort As the location on the Vye was central and easy of access for canoes, he chose it. In the course of time a church was added to the residence, with a hospis tal and a sort of hostel to lodge the visiting Indians. Finally when the Irequois began to invade the Kuron territory from all sides, friends of the missionaries in Prance obtained from the Home Government subsidies with which the fort in questien was built, and was garrisoned by a small force of Prench soldiers.

In the last year of its existence there were as many as 60 Frenchmen liv ing in the fort: about 15 missionaries. 3 Lay Brothers, a dozen Donnes or Oblates and a few domestics: the ba* lance was made un of soldierg. The missionaries travelled a score of miles in every direction remaining in outlying Missions the whole winter A farm of goodly size had been cleas red around the fort fur the suissenance of the inmates and the assistants of famished Indians.It wss stocked with cattle, and a few other domestic animals

In the spring of 1649 , when our Ca nadian Martyrs had already been tortue red and slain by the Iroquois, who we: re everywhere killing and burning the hapless maxumer Hurons the old fort was given over to the flames and the Fathers sought shelter with sume twe thousand refugees. on Christian Is about 30 riles to the West. Thus old Fort Ste Marie ilas beel hallewed by the presence of those suintly men now declared Blessed by the Church: it was for 10 years the Headquarters of the Huron Mission. Besides the bodies of Fr de Brebeuf and Lalemant ${ }_{0}$ when.
rescued from the hands of their slayers were laid near the church for one year and when their bones were carried to quebee in 1650, their flesh was left there to mingle with the soil
