Barefoot boys were seen around the Campus ses the first time this year on May 31st.


Retreat in preparation for Configuation began on May 30th.



Mr. R. Surtees attended a convention for Teachers at Sault St. Maris on Oct. 20th.


Reverend Father Provincial arrived on Oct. 24th for his annual visit.


