The accompanying plan of the Shugwauk property will give you an idea of the position of the different buildings & the distances apart are marked. I also enclose you photographs of all the buildings except the Bar & Carpenter's Cottage.

The Shugwauk Home or main building is a three storied solid stone building with single roof & brick chimneys. It is supplied with water pumped by steam power from the river shore by into a large tank (capacity 10,000 gallons) placed on top story main building.

There are hydrants on each floor connected with tank with hose attachments

attachment in case of fire, also we
 are able in the latter case to pump
 with steam force direct from the
 main through these Hydrants placed
 convenient to all the Buildings marked
 (See Plan)

The Chapel is a solid stone Buildg
 incased with timber.

Shugwash Hall, frame Buildg
 Stone foundation two stories upper
 used as a school room the ground
 floor as a play room.

Industrial Bldg, solid stone Bldg
