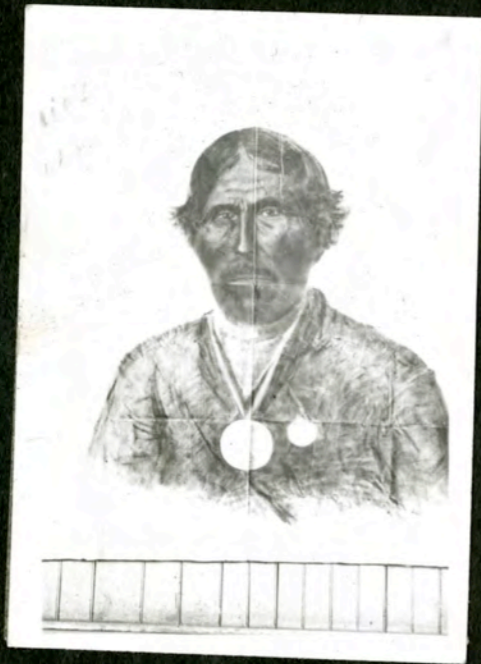

The Sault met Mr. and Mrs. Typical American Tourist and family with a big civic hello, Monday.

Stepping to Canadian soil at the ferry dock about 1.30 p.m., Mr. and Mrs. James J. Hackett with son Jim, age 10, and daughter Jill, age six, were greeted with a skirl of bag-pipes, red-jacketed mounties and President Fred Griffith, of the Junior Chamber of Commerce.

From then on, things took their natural course — as shown by the surrounding pictures.

At top left, President Griffith does the honors in introducing Mayor C. Herb Smale, (complete with Calgary stampede hat) to Mrs. Florence Hackett. Jim Hackett stands to one side, eyeing the scene for picture-taking possibilities.

At top right, Mr. Hackett makes immediate friends with a younger member of the local Ojibway tribe, while his family and President Griffith look on. The Hacketts were introduced to about 10 local tribe members, who appeared at the dock wearing complete traditional costumes.

At centre left, ten-year-old Jimmy gets a chance to thump a tom-tom that probably echoed over camp fires in early pioneer days. Chief Bill Pine offers a few pointers in the correct procedure.

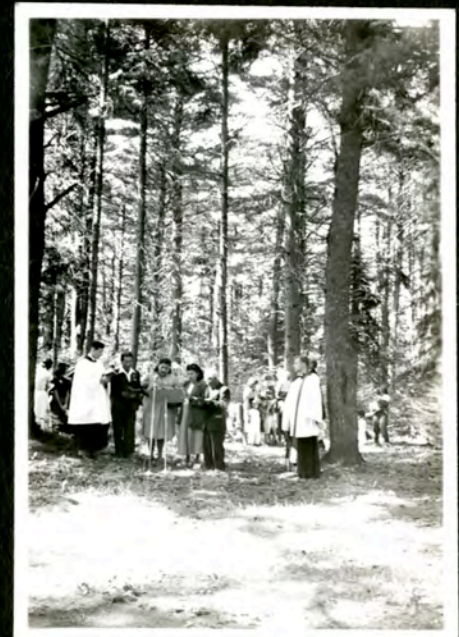

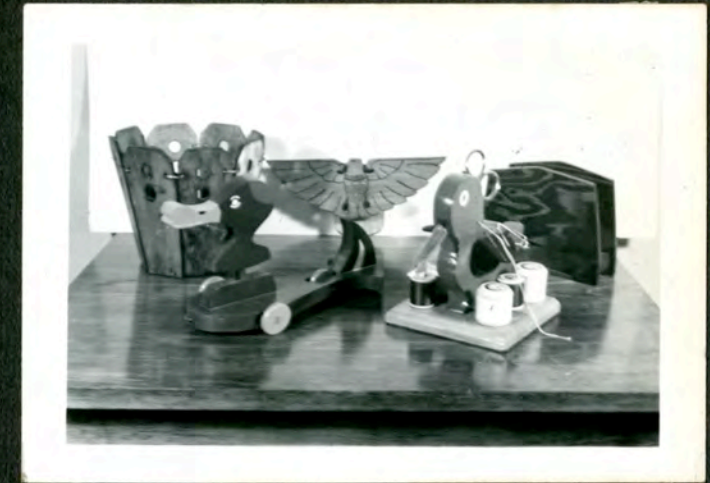

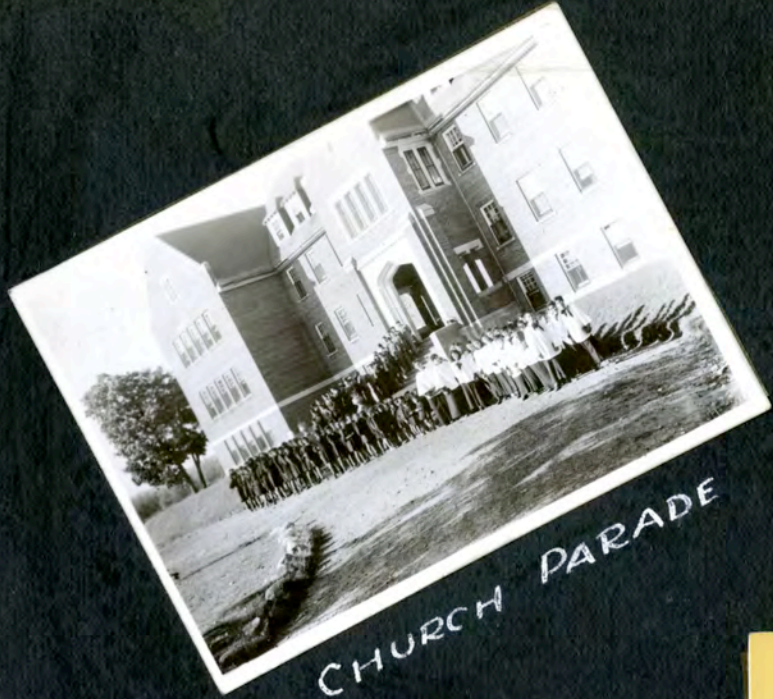

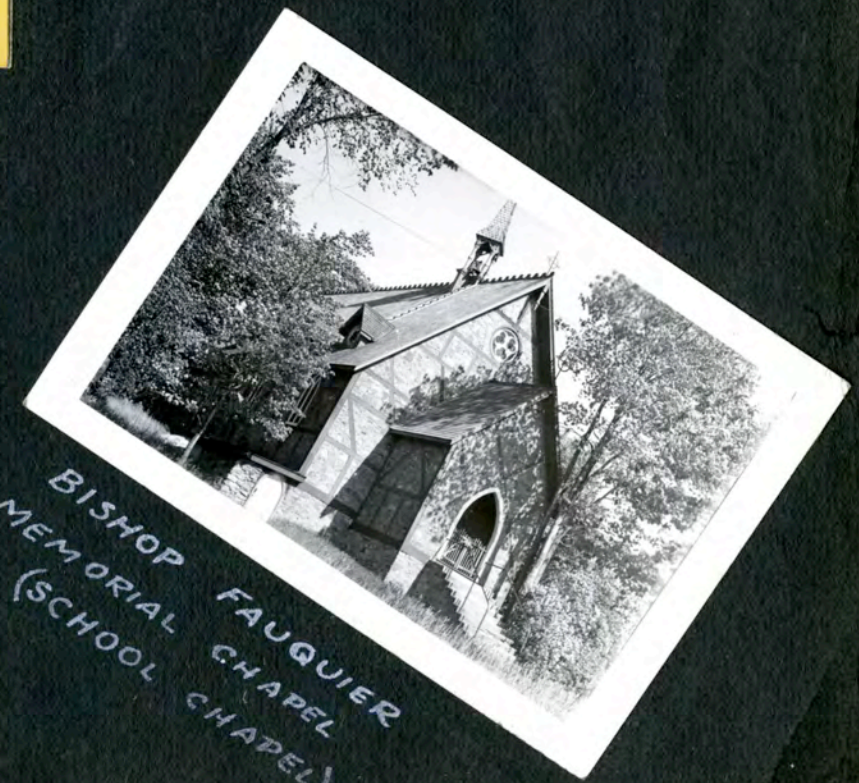

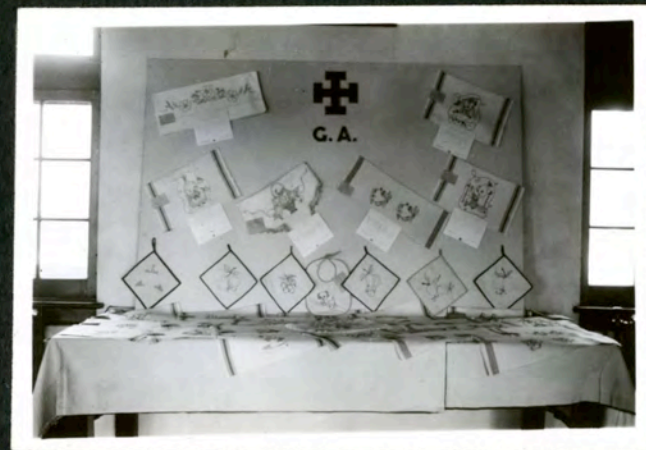
