Shingwauk Cemetery

See: E.F. Wilson, Algoma Missionary News, 1 July 1876

The cemetery was built on land donated by William and Sarah Stratton, originally of Sandwich, who owned the adjoining lot between the Shingwauk School and Shannon Road. Stratton was born in 1816 in England. The cemetery was consecrated on the 2nd of June 1876 by Bishop Fauquier. Land to the west of the cemetery was taken from the Shingwauk School and consecrated by Archbishop Thorneloe on the 9th of August 1925.

William Sahgucheway accompanied E.F. Wilson to England in 1879. He cleared the boulders in preparation for the spring burial of Bishop Fauquier in 1882. Suffering from tuberculosis he caught a cold and died before their bodies arrived.

Bishop Fauquier Memorial Chapel built under the supervision of E.F. Wilson in 1883.

Gowan Gillmor (1841 County Sligo, Ireland - 1 September 1928 Sault Ste. Marie); Son of the Rev'd Andrew Todd Gillmor and Mary Jemima Franklin; Sub-inspector (from 1875) of Royal Irish Constabulary 1869-1881 SPG Missionary CPR 1884-1885; d 1884 p 1885 (with Frederick Frost) Algoma; North Bay 1885-1889; Rosseau 1891-1907; Rural Dean of Parry Sound 1899-1903 (first to be elected); Archdeacon of Algoma 1903-1928; Bishop's Commissary 1903-1927; Travelling Missionary 1907-1920; St. Peter's, Sault Ste. Marie 1924-1927 & Shingwauk School; Retired to live in cottage at Shingwauk School 1927-1928; Trinity College, Toronto, Hon. DD 1910; First wife died in Ireland after a fall from a horse. Second wife suffered from mental illness. Son, Gowan Jr., died of TB in 1902 at the age of 26. Biography: E. Newton-White, Gillmor of Algoma: Archdeacon and Tramp, 1967.

F. Francis William Greene (1854 Port Nelson [York Factory] - November 1929 Aberdeen, Washington State) d 1881 p 1882 Rupertsland; from Port Nelson, NWT; St. Luke's Pro-Cathedral, SSM 1885-1890; Rural Dean of Algoma 1888-1890; Educated at St. John's, Winnipeg; Left for Escanaba, Michigan; American Episcopal Church until his death. Wife: Theresa; infant son Charles 'Charlie' buried in Shingwauk Cemetery - died 23 Januray 1888 - buried same day by E.F. Wilson.

Alfred Greaves (5 October 1878 Ivy, Virginia - 15 February 1940) - Ed. Keble College, Oxford 1897 & Trinity College, Toronto 1925-1927; Felsted School, Essex. Came to Canada in 1904 - first to Alberta then Stayner, Ontario; d 1927 p 1928 Algoma; Murillo & Oliver 1927-1934; Garden River 1934-1937; Blind River 1939; Retired to Gravenhurst Sanitarium 1939 with TB. Married the daughter of Canon Massey of Christ Church, Oxford.. Son Maurice John Greaves (1912-1937) was a teacher at Murillo, west of Thunder Bay and was preparing to enter Queen's University, Kingston.

Benjamin Fuller (8 May 1864 London, Ontario - 6 December 1945 Silverwater, Manitoulin Island) - grew up at Tenby Bay on St. Joseph's Island; Confirmed at Joselyn, St. Joseph's Island 1882; Ed. Huron College (extra-mural); d 1902 p 1906 Algoma; Nipigon 1902-1909; Principal of Shingwauk School 1909-1929; Silverwater 1929-1940; Garden River 1940-1945; Canon 1944; Buried with wife and family in Shingwauk Cemetery.

Edward Francis Wilson (7 December 1844 London, England - 11 May 1915 Victoria, BC). Grandson of Daniel Wilson, Bishop of Calcutta. Gentleman farmer at 17. Ed. Huron College; d 1867 London p 1869 Huron; Sarnia Indian Reserve 1867-1871; Garden River 1871-1875; summer 1888; Founder and first principal of Shingwauk Industrial School for Indians 1873-1892 and Wawanosh School for Girls 1879. Bishop's Commissary 1875-1882; Examining Chaplain to the Bishop of Algoma 1882-1885; Responsible for the construction of Bishop Fauquier Memorial Chapel 1883; Nominated for the Bishop of Algoma 1882; Military Chaplain Second Riel Rebellion 1885; Rector of Salt Spring Island 1893-1911; Retired to Santa Monica, California 1911-1915; Buried Ganges Harbour, BC. Married Frances Spooner. Editor: The Peace Pipe, Algoma Quarterly, Algoma Missionary News and Shingwauk Journal & Our Forest Children. Compiled and translated: A Manual of the Ojibway Language, 1874 & 1975. Wrote: Missionary Work Among the Ojibway, 1886.
