Algoma University Student Food Bank Coordinator Description

Hours of Work: 35 hours each week: Monday to Friday 9-5 Report to Algoma University Student Union

- 1. update all client files and enter into database
- 2. complete bi-weekly inventory to track number of food items being distributed
- 3. investigate and present findings on pursuing incorporation of the food bank as an independent not for profit organization
- 4. advocate for students via the AUSU Vice President External to the Canadian Federation of Students
- 5. explore potential partnerships for a March 2009 Can-struction Event
- 6. initiate fundraising activities
- 7. initiate awareness campaigns of student hunger
- 8. advertising within internal school community (via student newspaper etc) and external community in general
- 9. host on-campus focus groups

Environmental Impact: By securing a position for a full-time food bank coordinator students will have greater access to the food bank facilities, as it is now solely ran by student volunteers and access is limited to one day a week.
