Re: Indian Residential School  
Sioux Lookout, Ontario.



Recently while in Sioux Lookout I was informed that Indian Affairs was planning to recover the flooring in the two boys dormitories. I also noticed that not one of the beds was fitted with domes or casters.

Feeling that the new floor would hold up a very short time under use when beds have no casters or domes I have tried to locate something suitable with which to equip the beds. The Ashdown people in Edmonton have a suitable type of bed dome selling at 45¢ a set of four, which would mean an outlay of \$67.50 if all the children's beds in the school were equipped with these domes.

I am wondering if the Indian Affairs Branch would be willing to make this purchase so as to prolong the life of the floor soon to be laid.
